REPORT OF A COMMITTEE MEETING HELD TO CONSIDER
THE REQUEST FOR A POLICY REGARDS NAMING OF RED DEER
PARKLAND

October 26th, 1967

The representatives of this meeting were: Mr. Lorne Askins, President Old Timers and Pioneer Association; Mr. E. L. Meeres, President of the Red Deer and District Archives Committee; Alderman Mrs. L. H. Taylor.

The matter had arisen when the Old Timers and Pioneer Association had requested Red Deer City Council to name all City Parks after a distinguished pioneer person. The request had been tabled by Council at Mrs. Taylor's suggestion, to allow more study of the matter, and consideration of the facets of such a request by both the Old Timers and the Archives Committee. At the Council meeting when the proposal was made, Mrs. Taylor pointed out the possibility of such a policy precluding:

1. The naming of buildings, drives, etcetera, in honour of pioneer citizens (e.g. Annie Gaetz School);
2. The possibility of there being a younger deserving citizen being suitably honoured with a naming (e.g. Kerry Wood Drive);

At the meeting on October 26th of the three representatives, Mrs. Taylor drew attention to the naming of all streets of Morrisroe subdivision, after pioneer people whose names began with the letter "M". Considerable careful research had gone into the making of the list of suitable pioneer names, and the list is in City Hall records files, and also in the Archives Committee files.

In 1963, Red Deer's Golden Jubilee year, Galbraith Park was named and dedicated. Biographical record is on file.

In 1965, Stevenson Park was named, but it has not been dedicated.

In 1967, Snell's Floral Gardens was named, but has not been dedicated. Biographical material is on file with the City, and with the Archives Committee, regarding each of these three outstanding citizens involved in the namings (Stevenson Park honours both the Stevenson brothers who contributed so much to Red Deer in public service).

City Council did not allocate any budget in either 1966 or 1967 for purchase of dedication plaques or stones.

Mr. Askins, Mr. Meeres and Mrs. Taylor agreed that the following resolutions be presented to the Old Timers' and Pioneer Association, and the Archives Committee:

1. "Proposed Naming Policy for the City of Red Deer"
1. That the City of Red Deer accepts a policy that civic buildings, parks, drives, and streets where feasible, be named after outstanding citizens;
2. That the Red Deer Public School Board, and the Red Deer Hospital Board be asked to also adopt such a policy;
3. That the City of Red Deer be asked to notify the Old Timers' and Pioneers' Association when names are being proposed for such civic amenities.
4. That the Old Timers' and Pioneers' Association makes available to the City of Red Deer, the Public School Board and the Hospital Board a list of researched, suitable names of old timers.
5. That all present un-named parks be:
 - a) Zoned and allocated as park land;
 - b) That named parkland be checked as to park zoning definition;
 - c) That all parkland within the City not now named be suitably named and dedicated;
 - d) That City Council allocates an annual suitable amount for the costs of commemoration plaques, stones or other markers."
2. "Proposed that the triangle park at the intersection of Ross Street, 49th Street, and 46th Avenue at the foot of Michener Hill, be named Hugh Gilchrist Garden in appreciation of his service to the City of Red Deer in beautification leadership."
3. "The request for naming of another piece of park property in the City awaits clarification of land defines and ownership."

WILLIAM JAMES STEPHENSON

Wife - Leola May Glass Gaetz, daughter of Dr. Gaetz. Mr. Stephenson came to Red Deer in 1902. He served on the School Board for thirteen years, three years as Chairman. He served on the Municipal Hospital Board, Past President of Rotary Club, District Deputy Grand Master of the Masonic Lodge.

ALBERT THORBURN STEPHENSON

Albert Thorburn Stephenson was born in Orillia, Ontario in the 1870's. He attended the Orillia High School, Portage la Prairie Collegiate, Barrie Model School and Regina Normal School. He served in the South African War with the Lord Strathcona Horse and was awarded the Queen's Medal with four clasps. He was a member of the Canadian Coronation contingent at the coronation of King Edward VII in 1902. After the South African War he taught school and was the first teacher at Crossroads school. He came into Red Deer and taught in 1902 and 1903. He entered the hardware business with A.H. Illsley and remained in that firm until his appointment as Commissioner of The Town of Red Deer in the summer of 1908. For twenty-seven years he occupied that responsible position and much of Red Deer's fortunate position is due to his loyalty and administrative ability exercised throughout that long period on behalf of the citizens of the town. His service to the town and city of Red Deer led him naturally into wider fields, and his work with the Union of Alberta Municipalities, of which he was a vice-president in 1927 and 1928, brought him into touch with the provincial government and in 1927 he was appointed a member of the Alberta Taxation Commission.

He always had a close personal interest in the Red Deer Memorial Hospital, built to commemorate four Red Deer men who served with him and who lost their lives in South Africa. When the Municipal Hospital District was formed in 1921, he became the first secretary of the District and retained that post until his serious illness in 1935 made his resignation necessary. He was an active member of the Alberta Hospitals Association and served two years as its president. He was also a member of the Alberta Advisory Committee on health for some years. For several years he served as secretary of the Board of Trade, in which he was keenly interested.

He joined the Masonic fraternity as a young man, and was Worshipful Master of Red Deer Lodge No. 12 in 1908, and District Deputy Grand Master in 1911-12. He was a charter member of the Red Deer Rotary Club, and was an active member of the Canadian Legion.

The purchase by the City in 1926 of the power plant of the Western General Electric Company was a source of great satisfaction to Mr. Stephenson, and the rapid and continuous improvements in the City's financial position following that transaction pleased him greatly. He played an important part in the successful negotiations which preceded the taking over of the plant by the City.

His abilities were by no means confined to his work on behalf of the City and the Hospital. As a youth he won the junior chess championship of Ontario in 1891, and he remained a keen bridge player up to a few months before he died. Out of doors his record was even more impressive. He played football in Saskatchewan and in Red Deer and was a strong bowler in the early cricket teams here when Pine Lake used to field a strong team against Red Deer. He was a good fisherman and had a hand in the first stocking of the creeks west of Red Deer with trout fingerlings. With a gun he was a crack shot at the traps and in the field, and he was an active member of the Red Deer Gun Club in earlier years. He played a steady game of golf and was an early member of the Red Deer Club.

For many years he cultivated one of the outstanding gardens in the city and was active in the work of the Horticultural Society. Each year he presented some hundreds of packets of seeds to the Women's Institutes over Central Alberta, all taken from his own garden.

During his service in South Africa he contracted malaria and he was never wholly free from it for the rest of his life. In 1933 he had serious stomach trouble and he was operated on at Rochester. He recovered from this severe drain on his system and was in reasonable health until January 1935 when he became almost completely paralyzed. It was from this point that he began his real fight. He was determined that he would beat the paralysis, and he did. Except for some lack of full movement in his hands and feet, he won out after two years and was able to get about and to work in his garden.

In 1903 Mr. Stephenson was married to Miss Isabel Jenkins at Red Deer, and her loyal and unselfish help were his during his long illness. Four daughters and two sons survive.

COMMENTS OF COMMISSIONERS

On May 3rd, 1965 Council considered the Central Alberta Pioneers' and Old Time Association proposals regarding the naming of sites, parks and streets after pioneers. Council decided as follows: "Council of The City of Red Deer do hereby resolve that the Civic Recognition Committee meet with the Central Alberta Pioneers and Old Timers Association and Archives Committee for the purpose of discussing proposal of the said Association re: naming of streets, parks etc. after pioneers and recommend to Council action to be taken".

The Pioneer's Association and Archives Committee were notified on May 7th, 1965 of Council's decision.

It is considered that Council would be well advised to defer any naming of further properties or streets after pioneers until the two groups have met and compiled a full list of these names and biographies of those to be commemorated in this way.

PROPOSED NAMES FOR MORRISROE SUBDIVISION

Submitted by Alderman Mrs. Taylor

A great deal of careful checking has been done regarding possible names of Pioneer Red Deer district people beginning with the letter "M". It is possible someone of the early days has been overlooked. On the other hand, there are more names available than are needed in the numbers of streets to be named now in the Morrisroe subdivision.

This makes it difficult to choose, as all the pioneers with names beginning with "M" contributed something worthwhile to the progress of this area and therefore to the City of Red Deer; and present records and memories can easily overlook some outstanding contribution of an early citizen.

Therefore the names which have been chosen are not just signal honouring of these particular citizens, but of all the citizens with name beginning with "M" who in large or small measure helped build the community of Red Deer so well that the City of Red Deer now expands into another subdivision, to be named Morrisroe in commemoration of the pioneer family whose land now becomes part of the City.

As only some of the names can be allocated now, the remaining list will be left until final development of the total subdivision area.

The names of Michener, Moore and McLean are already recognized in the naming of Michener Hill, Moore Crescent, and McLean Playing Field of the Central School complex. Edward Michener gave outstanding service and leadership to this area and to the nation and was named a Senator. John T. Moore developed Red Deer's electrical system and also contributed greatly to the growing pioneer community. W.J. McLean was the first Inspector of Schools in Red Deer, and continued in this position for many years.

In choosing the names for Morrisroe streets, the name of Fred Moore, resident of the Red Deer area since 1912 and alderman of the City for the past 12 years, poses a problem in that Moore Crescent and Moore Street or Close could lead to confusion, especially to newcomers, and in mailing. Michener Street, likewise might be associated with Michener Hill rather than Morrisroe.

Lochlan MacLean has enriched this community with his sterling qualities and fine leadership. But if the coincident use of Michener and Moore are eliminated, the precedent of using the name MacLean twice (even though spelled differently) does not seem advisable.

These three names, therefore, are not included in the following list.

WHEREAS these reasons will combine to the eventual necessity of bringing water to the prairies from the river supplies of the Fraser and/or other tributaries of the Columbia River, and,

Dear Sir:

In order that this office may proceed with the registration of the first stage of the Morrisroe Subdivision, it is necessary that we designate the name of the subdivision as well as the name or street numbers to be registered by the plan of survey. Attached are two copies of the overall subdivision layout for the Morrisroe quarter for which we have indicated a street numbering system on one print with the other print indicating a suggested system of street names.

It will be noted that in both cases we have indicated that the subdivision name should follow its present designation of "Morrisroe". For this reason all street names commence with the letter "M" indicating that streets such as Mitchell, McNiel and McDonald are located in the Morrisroe Subdivision.

It will be noted from comparing the two systems of designation the names appear to be the most satisfactory method of designation. In view of the fact that the subdivision is based upon a modified grid, it is impractical to continue the street and avenue designations on the basis of a standard east-west and north-south grid numbers.

It is my recommendation to Council that the subdivision name should follow the designation of "Morrisroe" with the street system being designated as names as recorded on the enclosed plan.

Re: Proposed new Planning Bill

I am in receipt of your letter of February 14th, note the contents and wish to comment as follows:

(1) Road Widening as a Feature of a Subdivision Plan

The new Planning Bill as it will be printed will not contain any provision for road widening as part of a subdivision proposal without compensation. This is as the Minister responsible wishes it to be at this time. However, he has told me that he will prefer the matter to be debated from the floor of the House, so I would suggest to you that you inform your local M.L.A. and brief him accordingly.

In passing, I wish to notify you, apropos the second paragraph of your letter, that Regulation 28 of the Subdivision and Transfer Regulations 185/60 as amended, makes no provision for an approving authority to require road widening as a condition of subdivision approval, as you state. Regulation 28 merely states the minimum widths of different classes of streets and secondly, it provides for land in addition to the above be made available in the subdivision plan, where definite proposals for future traffic circles or other major street intersections have been adopted. It makes no reference to road widening, as in fact the whole of the Subdivision and Transfer Regulations makes no such provision.

(2) Public Reserves

Provision for the deferment of public reserves has been incorporated in the Bill, and provisions for the waiving of the land itself will only be permissible if money in lieu is provided. There will be no blanket waiver as in the past.



Street Names Suggested For Red Deer

A proposal that Red Deer institute names instead of numbers for streets and avenues, particularly in the new subdivisions like Sunnybrook and Fairview, was presented to council Monday by the Technical Planning Committee and received approval in principle. A part of the plan would be the erection of large map boards at the entrance to the subdivisions showing the street layout with the names. Members of the committee are the mayor, commissioner, city engineer and planning director.

To distinguish the various subdivisions, the proposal suggested that all Sunnybrook names start with "S" and Fairview with "F."

The report said the grid-numbering system had been abandoned by most cities as new types of planning created curved streets, crescents and cul-de-sacs. It also recommended that all major thoroughfares such as Gaetz Ave. (50 Ave.) and Ross St. (50 St.) be designated solely by name because the numbering system becomes confusing as the thoroughfares change direction and relation to side streets and avenues.



We have been requested to produce suggestions for City Council regarding the naming of ~~six~~^{seven} residential subdivisions. As you know we have in Red Deer the Waskasoo Creek which we understand is Indian for Red Deer. One of our subdivisions is called Waskasoo.

It has occurred to us that there may be some attractive Indian names appropriate to these areas and would be grateful if you could give us some help in this respect.

Neighborhood #1 - (South of Mountview - owner Mr. Bower.)

This is an area of some 150 acres of good, well drained, arable land bordered by a creek valley some 200 - 300 feet wide and 50 feet deep. This valley is covered with mature spruce. The Creek is known as "Piper's Creek" after a Mr. Piper who had a brick works some 40 years ago on the confluence of Piper's Creek and Waskasoo Creek. This Creek is the home of a colony of beavers who have built many dams in the creek.

A name connected with Piper, Spruce, Bower or beaver would seem appropriate.

Neighborhood #2 - (South of Eastview - owner Mr. Morrisroe)

This is an area of some 160 acres of good, well drained, arable land. There would not appear to be any particular association of name with this land. The "Maryview" School is now located on the property and a major thoroughfare known as the "Clearview" road bounds the property on the West.

Are there any Indians of renown connected with Red Deer whose names might be commemorated and which would be appropriate?





It is recommended that in all official correspondence the use of the neighbourhood name should be used in order to encourage a sense of "neighbourhood" or "community" in the areas concerned.

In line with this recommendation we would suggest that the name "Hillsborough" should no longer be used, particularly as there may be some stigma attached to this name. All properties within the S.E. quarter of Section 15 should in future be referred to as Eastview.

This brings up the question of the shopping centre in the N.E. quarter of Section 10 which is being loosely referred to as the "Eastview Shopping Centre". This site is not in the Eastview neighbourhood or quarter section and it is recommended that this name should not be used. The name should either be the same as that to be selected for the Morrisroe quarter or a general name applicable for the Whole East Hill which it will serve e.g. "Easthill Shopping Centre".

Some thought should be given to the naming of the future subdivisions (neighbourhoods) in

- (1) N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ 10 - Morrisroe
- (2) S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ 9 - Bower

A By-law of the City of Red Deer to

(c) In case that changes are necessitated in the future by reason of further surveys of land or for any other reason the changes or additions so required shall be added to this by-law by resolution of the Council.

2. All dwellings and mercantile buildings in the City of Red Deer shall be numbered in accordance with the following general rule.

(a) Even numbers shall be placed on the north and west sides of streets and avenues and odd numbers shall be placed on the south and east sides of streets and avenues.

(b) Numbers shall increase from the south and East and shall have the number of the street or avenue immediately south or east as a prefix.

(c) There shall be one number allotted to each 25 feet portion thereof of frontage.

(d) The numbers shall be supplied and attached by and at the expense of the City.

(e) The numbers shall be placed in a prominent position and unless a more prominent position is available such as a porch or verandah, they shall be placed above the door.

(f) Schedule A to this By-law, being a list of the lots in the City with allotted numbers, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of this by-law.

(g) In case that changes are necessitated in the future by reason of further surveys of land or for any other reason, the Commissioners are hereby authorized and directed to enlarge the said schedule in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.

(h) If the necessity arises in the future the Commissioners are hereby authorized to change the number on any house or property.

2. By-laws numbers 429 and 1107 are hereby repealed.
