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LETTER NO. 3

Dear Sir:-

Re: Application for License to sell beer.

It is our understanding that a group of business men have submitted  
an application to the Government Liquor Control Board for a license to sell beer in  
a proposed new hotel in the City of Red Deer for approval by the City and that the  
City has already indicated its approval of a similar application with respect to  
the licensing of the Park Hotel.

The City's powers extend only to the licensing of a public hotel as  
provided for in Sections 365, 366 and 367 of the City Act and do not extend to a  
license to sell beer which comes solely under the jurisdiction of the Liquor Control  
Board.

Section 33(2) of the Liquor Control Act provides for four licenses  
for a city having a population of three thousand and an additional license for each  
additional four thousand population. Since the population of the City of Red Deer  
is in excess of seven thousand the act would permit the granting of one additional  
beer license but would not permit the granting of an additional license until the  
population reaches eleven thousand since the Section does not provide for a license  
for a proportionate part of four thousand population.

In our opinion it does not come within the jurisdiction of the City  
of Red Deer to determine whether or not an additional beer license should be granted  
or if there is more than one application for a beer license, to whom such license  
should be granted and that the City may merely indicate whether or not it objects  
to the granting of one or more additional beer licenses.

This is entirely a matter of policy to be determined by the City Council.

This letter is sent in on behalf of several good taxpayers from the "South Hill" area, thirty-seventh street to be precise, appealing to you for some action to be taken regards proper drainage for this street, avenue and alley leading thereoff, to the north.

Every spring the water drains across my lots taking the best part of the soil with it, leaving a muddy pot hole at the corner that keeps this alley soft and impassible, despite repair several times a year, breeding mosquitos, being a general recepticle for tin cans, broken bottles, city road repair stops, all for the sake of a culvert or two.

We have drawn this condition to the attention of "Councillor Sims" and feel that these statements will be verified. Thanking you in advance for having occupied your valuable time and hoping that we can receive attention to this matter.

Gentlemen:-

1. We are out of lots for sale for the construction of medium sized houses. The exceptional demand of this season has used up all of the property on Michener Hill and it becomes necessary to extend the services so as to make nine lots available.

2. The sewer has been installed on 51 St. east from 42 Ave. to what was once the Alex Munro house. A few hundred feet will extend it to 40 Avenue.

3. The water is not on this street at all so we should have to instal two blocks of water line to make available approximately 28 sites between 42 and 40 avenues.

4. The cost of this would work out approximately as follows:

31.00 - 50'  
12 - 50'  
902' of water line ..... \$4,068.94  
258' of sewer line..... 522.24 2.70  
TOTAL.. \$4,591.18 ←

5. He should have to sell 13 lots to pay for the cost of this installation at the proposed new rates and there are several applications available, one being for 3 sites for houses he has already sold and must get land to build them on.

6. Apparently the mortgage companies have so far not agreed to lend on our land at the south end, nor in West Park so it will be necessary to consider the purchase of some land for development. It is true that the V.L.A. area has a number of sites but from a long term view we should consider getting new land.

7. It is true that we have a big program of construction for 1952 and some will not get done. The installation of this line might be given priority because of our lot shortage. In any case, the water table north of the river is giving us a lot of trouble and it might be advisable in any case to leave the work west of the school till next year in the hope that the ditches being dug this year east of the school might have the effect of lowering this water table.

DRAFT BY-LAW

BY-LAW NO.....

A by-law of the City of Red Deer controlling and regulating the parking of vehicles within the City.

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RED DEER ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Definitions:

(a) "City Parking Lot" shall mean a place designated by the City for the parking of motor vehicles.

(b) "Motor Vehicle" means every vehicle propelled by any power other than muscular power.

(c) "Vehicle" means a motor vehicle, trailer, traction engine, any vehicle drawn, propelled or driven by any kind of power, including muscular power.

2. The City may from time to time establish parking lots which shall be available for the parking of motor vehicles other than trucks in excess of one-half ton in size.

3. All other vehicles are prohibited from being parked on City parking lots.

4. Motor vehicles shall not be parked in a City parking lot for a continuous period in excess of twenty-four hours.

5. The City, through its authorized agents and/or employees, may in its absolute discretion remove any vehicle prohibited by this by-law from being parked in a City parking lot and may move any motor vehicle improperly parked, blocking or obstructing an exit or entrance and may move or remove any vehicle parked in a City parking lot in the case of fire, storm or other emergency.

6. The City shall not be responsible in the case of a motor vehicle parked in a City parking lot for the theft of such motor vehicle or of any part thereof or of its contents; for any damage caused to a vehicle through the act of any employee or agent of the City carrying out the provisions of this by-law or for any other damage done to a motor vehicle as a result of fire, storm, emergency or through any other cause whatsoever.

7. Vehicles shall not be parked by their owners on private property of other persons or corporations without the property owner's permission.

8. Penalties for infractions of this by-law shall be as follows:

(a) For the first infraction:

Parking in excess of twenty-four hours - \$2.00

Parking in excess of forty-eight hours - 5.00

Parking in excess of seventy-two hours - 10.00

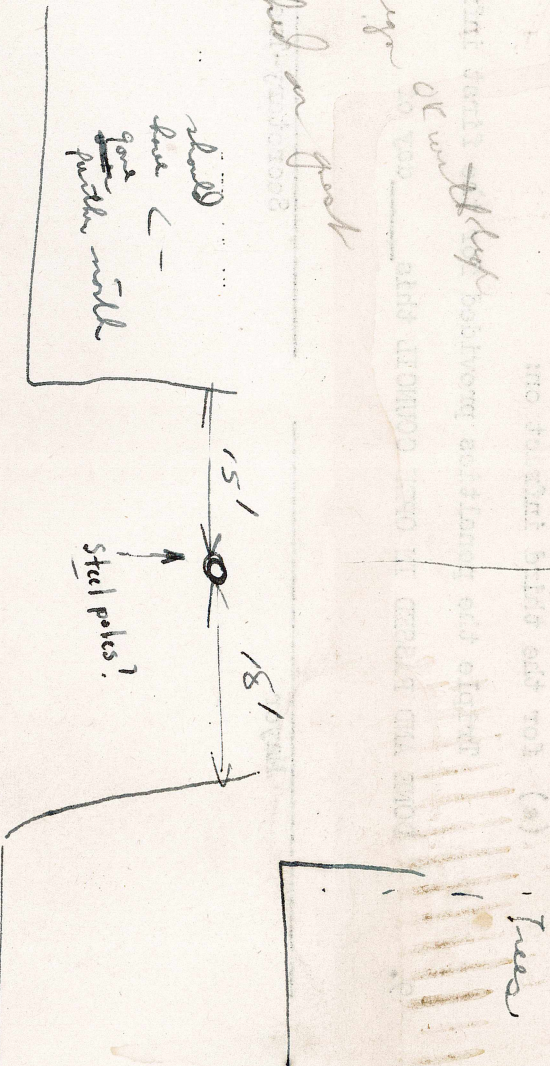
