History

At the Monday, June 18, 2001 meeting of Council, Land Use Bylaw Amendment 3156/V-2001 was given first reading.

Land Use Bylaw Amendment 3156/V-2001 deals with rezoning of Lot 8 MR from P1 Parks and Recreation District to PS Public School Service (Institutional or Government) District. This site has been identified as a location for a future Catholic K-9 school. The proposed amendment complies with the Rosedale Meadows Outline Plan and the East Hill Area Structure Plan.

Public Consultation Process



In 1997, under Land Use Bylaw Amendment 3156/R-97, Lot 8 MR was rezoned to P1 Parks and Recreation District. As Lot 8 MR was the final portion of the land assembly for the central park/school site, it needs to be zoned PS Public Service (Institutional or Government) District to correspond with the rest of the lands previously assembled. The central park/school site has been identified as a location for a future Catholic K-9 school.

The proposed LUB amendment complies with the Rosedale Meadows Outline Plan and the East Hill Area Structure Plan.

Staff Recommendation

Planning staff recommend that City Council proceed with first reading of Land Use Bylaw Amendment 3156/V-2001.



**Re: Land Use Bylaw Amendment 3156/V-2001 - Rosedale Meadows Public Service District
Land Use Amendment**

On behalf of the 700 plus Rosedale electors who hereby petition City Council to refuse to grant approval to the zoning change for the eastern portion of the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park from P1 to PS, I request that our attached petition be placed on the agenda for the Public Hearing Monday, July 16th, 2001, of the Council Meeting.

Our immediate concern is to block the construction of the Catholic Middle School 6-9 proposed for the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park by the Red Deer Catholic Regional Division No. 39. Our long term goal is the preservation of the entire Rosedale Neighbourhood Park for the present and future recreation needs of all Rosedale residents.

Our reasons for petitioning City Council to refuse to approve the zoning change for the eastern portion of the park include the following:

1. Residents of Rosedale were not properly notified of a change from elementary school site to a K-9 school site.
2. A sign was not erected indicating the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park consisted of a K-9 School site by the Red Deer Catholic Regional Division No. 39 as set out in the City Guidelines.
3. Other more suitable sites for a K-9 Catholic school exist in Red Deer with better access to arterial roads for the busing of rural students and students from Kentwood, Normandeau, Pines, Glendale, and Fairview. The proposed Rosedale Middle School will be placed only 2.8 km away from the only other Catholic middle school serving Red Deer.
4. Concerns that a school housing approximately 600 students would cause an increase in traffic on already heavily used collector roads to beyond what is recommended for these roads.
5. The Rosedale Neighbourhood Park is now complete with sports fields and recreation facilities that are now heavily utilized by children of the community of Rosedale as well as other communities. With the increase in high density homes in Phase III, there will be a greater demand on the use of these recreational facilities. Rosedale presently has 10% greenspace of which only one park exists with sports fields. This 10% greenspace includes the berms to the north, south and west of Rosedale.
6. Concern for the adjacent natural habitat park and a large adult community where most residents are retired seniors.

RE: PROPOSED ROSEDALE SCHOOL

We would like to share our thoughts on the proposed Rosedale school. We support the rezoning of the park area and the building of a school for any age.

We purchased our lot and had our house built in Rosedale in 1995. At that time, we were well aware that a school was planned for our neighbourhood. When the option to build on the school site changed hands from one school district to another, we were aware of that also. Because the Rosedale extension was largely vacant when we moved in, we made it our priority to stay informed of developments in our neighbourhood. Access to accurate, up-to-date information was not difficult. We have found City of Red Deer staff knowledgeable, considerate and willing to assist us. Over the years, we have inquired about streetlights, area maps, speed limits, garbage pickup and the school site.

As new Rosedale residents, we have attended as many community association meetings as we have been able. Of the meetings we have attended over the past 6 years, attendance has been low, never exceeding 20 people. Greg Scott represented the City of Red Deer at some of those meetings, dutifully posting future plans for Rosedale on the walls and available to answer questions and address concerns. Very few residents took advantage of these opportunities to educate themselves regarding plans for the neighbourhood.

When the Catholic School Board received approval for this project, we were pleased. A middle school in our neighbourhood presented many positives. We were excited at the thought that the school may house courses, drop-in sports and meeting space. Our 3 children currently attend St. Patrick's Community School, and prior to our move to year-round schooling when it became available 3 years ago, our children attended Holy Family School for 6 years. We are very familiar with the procedures in the Catholic School District and have been very pleased with our children's experiences. If we should decide to return our children to a traditional calendar school, 2 of them would be eligible to attend the proposed Rosedale school. Our oldest just finished grade 9.

We have two concerns regarding the recent uprising of opposition to the school:

Our first concern centers on personal responsibility. As community members, we have made it our priority to stay informed of developments in our community. Progress on the

school site has not been a surprise to us. We believe that some of our neighbours may have received misleading information regarding the school site; however, we believe this number is very small. Information gathering is not a passive process –it is a process that requires us to take some initiative in asking questions and seeking answers. We believe many of the now dissatisfied Rosedale residents reneged on their personal responsibility to access accurate information regarding development in this community. An investment of \$200,000+ should warrant much investigation on the part of the investor.

Our second concern is regarding the current behaviour and attitudes of some Rosedale residents.

We are extremely disheartened at the concerns expressed regarding the negative impact a school would have in our neighbourhood. Many residents have jumped on the “Opposition Bandwagon”, even though they had prior knowledge of the school.

Concerns regarding traffic have been blown entirely out of proportion. We feel the city planners and school board representatives have adequately addressed these concerns. At the public meeting, unfortunately, it appears many people attended to speak and not to listen. Homeowners who buy or build on through streets (or collector roads) must expect that traffic will increase as the community grows. Homeowners with serious traffic concerns buy or build in more secluded locations, and usually pay more for that choice.

Concerns regarding vandalism are equally overblown. We have had acts of vandalism in the past and will continue to have in the future. We attended a Rosedale Community Association meeting where there was an attempt to broaden the Neighbourhood Watch program beyond the 3 blocks that were participating at the time. No one came forward to coordinate the program.

Many residents claim they don't want to lose any green space. We suspect that most residents across the city would like more green spaces in their neighbourhood. We, too, think that having a 13-acre front yard paid for by the City would be a wonderful asset; however, the school site has always been in the Rosedale plan. The school year has 190 teaching days; this leaves 175 days per year that there will be no one attending the school.

Should the proposed school in Rosedale not proceed because of the opposition, we believe two important messages will be sent to the public:

Message #1:

Long-range city and school board planning is irrelevant. A powerful precedent will be set by allowing residents who are having second thoughts about a school nearby dictate the direction of the city as a whole. “No school in Rosedale” doesn't equate to “no new school”. Very few residents bought or built without knowledge of the proposed school. If Rosedale residents can ban schools from their neighbourhood, other communities will have the same opportunity. **Where will we build our schools?** Will our children be bussed to schools sitting out in the middle of undeveloped land so not one will have to put up with them? Will the residents in Lancaster or College Heights be more tolerant of our

children than the people of Rosedale? We thought we lived in a family-friendly community; however, it appears we're trading adult-living for middle school children. There is no reason that seniors and youth cannot peacefully co-exist in Rosedale.

Message #2:

We expect our children to misbehave. This message has been repeated in many forms over the past week. The alarmist mentality that has overtaken many Rosedale residents is appalling. We have attended, assisted and chaperoned many school-related and extra-curricular events with our children. The vast majority of young people we have come into contact with are interesting, exciting, intelligent and respectful people. Similarly, so are most of the adults we come into contact with. Concerns about groups of young people hanging around, damaging property, smoking drugs and fighting are unfounded. Do these activities occur among middle school students – yes. Often – no. Do these activities occur among adults – yes. Often – no. What are we afraid of? That our young people will behave exactly as we did when we were that age?! Responsible adults tolerated us, some of them even nurtured and guided us through those years. We were not forced into isolation until we “grew up”.

We walk through our neighbourhood almost every night, sometimes as early as 9:00 p.m., sometimes as late as midnight. We've seen those middle school students; oh yes, they're already in our neighbourhood. They're shooting hoops, racing around remote-controlled vehicles, biking, rollerblading and “hanging out” with their friends. They deliver our newspaper and babysit for our neighbours. They ring our doorbell fundraising for their own activities.

Transition can be a tough time - for young people and for young neighbourhoods. It can also be a rewarding time. Some people feel threatened by change, others see opportunity.

Please promote healthy communities. Approve and encourage schools where our youth can intermingle with the residents, learn about respectful community living and even teach us a few things in the process!

I am a resident of the Rosedale Community. I must say I'm very disappointed and quite disgusted at what the Rosedale Community Association has done to our neighborhood. Different signs have been posted about the proposed school on all mail boxes and entrances for the past couple of weeks. "500 names collected" , the latest one reads. Wow! What an accomplishment! All that hard work is paying off it seems. All that hard work to stop a school, stop education!

Your smear campaign in the neighborhood and in the press reflects a bad image of the Rosedale Community as a whole. We are your friends and neighbors, so please don't shove that petition in our faces anymore! How many names on that petition are actually Rosedale Association members? I fail to see why the petition is going 6 blocks away from the school site. Through all your bad press and advertising we are all aware of where to go if we want to sign it. Leave it alone and show some pride in building a community, which unfortunately for some includes children and schools.

We moved to this area ,and so did many other family's because we were told there would be a K-9 school at that park. A K-9 school includes middle school. Most of us don't feel that we need to publicly announce that we are for the school. We feel that the Catholic Board has done it's job and all the issues were handled correctly. It should be a done deal. The people who support this school in this area would be considerably less than the very vocal opposition, because of the large number of seniors and non Catholics involved.

The facts are simple. The Catholic School Board obtained the school site in late 1997from the Public School Board. The Catholic Board gave the community every opportunity through public meetings and advertising over the past 2 years, to voice their concerns. Red Deer City Council:

We live in Rosedale, adjacent to the proposed school site. We made an informed decision to purchase a lot across from this site. We have always known that the park would have a school.

We are familiar with the designation of school sites. I have seen the "East Hill Area Structure Plan" many times. As it states it is a "plan." You can't just pick up a school site and move it someplace else.

Ted Olson purchased all the lots on Ritson Close. At the time of purchase and at the present time, the park in question was to have a school site. Mr. Olson's call to the chairman of the Public School Board, on behalf of Mr. Nichols, concerning the school site would give Mr. Olson the answer "No, we are not building a school on the designated site." A phone call to the Catholic School Board would have given Mr. Olson the answer "Yes, we are building a school on the site." When Mr. Nichols purchased his lot, the Public Board had already turned the site over to the Catholic School Board. The decision to build upscale housing was Mr. Olson's. If the neighborhood didn't suit his plans, he should have built elsewhere.

Mr. Olson has been building in Red Deer for many years. He knows that he can get "up-to-date" information from many sources. If a school was such a concern to his clients, he owed it to them to cover his bases a little more thoroughly than making a phone call to a friend. The "beef" from Ritson Cl. residents is with Mr. Olson not the Catholic School Board.

Education was a big issue in the last Provincial election- a cry for more funding and smaller classes. If you don't build schools, how are you going to have smaller classes?

Rosedale now has a chance to have a school. The funding is in place, the architectural plans are available. City council should have no problem re-zoning the area in question. It was a city clerical error. The correction for this should come from the city- no question. How could City Council turn down what appears to be an up-to-date, modern, nine million dollar school.

There is now a petition circulating with the goal of nixing the school because it wasn't zoned properly. You can put it under whatever category suits you, but you really aren't interested in education when your priorities are to try and stop a school from being built. How can some Rosedale residents work so hard to squash a school in this area, or any area. The opposed citizens in Rosedale got thirty canvassers in one night. I'm sure that the Heart and Stroke Foundation would love to have that list of eager canvassers.

For Rosedale residents busing their children out to other school districts, I hope your children are treated with more respect than the children about to enter the Rosedale system.

Strong opposition is coming from the adult community located east of the school. Many names on the petition will be from this area. I think 80% of the adult community would have grandchildren. They must attend school in some district. Your opposition to the school says "I raised my children right", but my children didn't raise the grandchildren right.

The word vandalism is used frequently in opposition to the school. Vandalism is not something that has sprung up in the last ten years. In the 1970's and '80's we had a school set on fire three times, we had large scale damage to another school during the construction. It is not a new issue that only applies to the children of today.

Traffic and location are concerns. The location is good for a middle school. Elementary schools bring a lot of traffic. Middle schools bring foot traffic along with six buses in the morning and six buses at school closing. The buses could enter from highway 11

and Ross street and proceed to Reichley street, do the bus loop at the school and leave the same way. I think that this is a location that disturbs very little of the community traffic-wise.

The Catholic School Board held a meeting at Holy Family School to present Rosedale residents with information and a model of the school. People didn't listen and few viewed the model of the proposed school. A table was set up at the school entrance with a group of people asking you to sign a petition opposing the school. This was BEFORE the presentation. How can you make an educated decision if you sign the petition and then listen to the presentation. It was pretty much a close minded session.

I believe the 3.46 acres to be re-zoned includes the dual football-soccer field. In essence, for the sake of approximately 2 acres of grass, people are lining up to do away with the school. Red Deer is a city with a lot of growth. We need every school that we can get.

I hope that City Council will not let this petition influence their decision when re-zoning the site.

To the opposed the "Not in my backyard policy," I have to say that we would be proud to have our grandchildren in our backyard any time. To those looking to hear from influential people, I have spent many years getting my S.C.P.G. degree. That stands for "Senior Citizen, Proud Grandparent!"







It was then reverted back to park land and therefore was not slated for development. It was also the consensus of that department that given the direction the city was growing at the time that if a school were to be built it would be in Lancaster Park. Having been provided with this information we proceeded with the purchase of what we felt would be an ideal location for our retirement home. Although the house was one of the more expensive in Rosedale, we felt it a wise investment. A secluded close location, bordered by a natural tree reserve on one side, Rosedale park on the other and our closest neighbors a community of seniors. What could be more perfect?



- The quiet, peaceful neighborhood we now enjoy will no longer exist as school activities and extra curricular activities take place at the school.




I am 100% opposed to building any school in the Rosedale recreational area.





RE: PROPOSED MIDDLE SCHOOL IN THE ROSEDALE NEIGHBOURHOOD PARK

I wish to make know to Council, as a private citizen, my opposition to the construction of a school in the Rosedale Park, particularly a middle school. I wish to take this opportunity to set forth what I understand to be errors in the zoning planning process which has led to this conflict with the Rosedale Community on the part of the City planning process and City Council, together with the Catholic School Board.

At first, I will say that I am shocked at the rapidity with which the Catholic School Board is proposing to charge ahead with construction of the school. If the time frame is followed in accordance with what has already occurred, it will almost be an impossible task for the people in Rosedale to have an effective say in whether this school is constructed or, if constructed, what type of school should be there. Within virtually days of the approval of funding for the construction of the school by the province, and amendment was before Council for Reading #1 to change the zoning of part of the park from P1 to PS. P1 I understand to be park designation and PS I understand to be school designation. The eastern third or so of the park is presently zoned P1. The fact that this zoning change was put before Council in first reading so quickly leads me to conclude that there is an attempt to get the zoning change passed before any effective say or input can be made by the people who live in Rosedale. Secondly, the second reading is set for July 16, 2001. The timing of this zoning change is in the middle of the summer when many people have other plans and are away. There have been comments in the paper from City Officials that the zoning change is a mere technicality and other comments that the Council has no choice but to approve the zoning change. It would be my understanding that each Councilor who has a vote can vote yes or no to the change. They can vote for whatever reasons they feel are appropriate and legitimate in the overall circumstances of this development. Nobody is bound to vote for this zoning change. It is almost as if the City spokesman and the Catholic School Board present this as a done deal. The rapidity with which this change is taking place leads me to conclude that neither the Catholic School Board nor City Council wants to hear from the citizens who live in Rosedale.

I was particularly surprised to read a letter under the signature of a City Hall official which said in writing that the last date on which letters, or other material, would be received for consideration on the second reading of this zoning amendment was July 3, 2001. That is the Tuesday immediately following the July long week. The meeting held at the Holy Family School to discuss the proposed school was only the week before this July 3 deadline. It was, in fact, Tuesday, June 26. Rosedale Community held a meeting of people interested in opposing the school on Thursday, June 28. There was a letter circulated by a City official saying the deadline for making any submissions, including a petition, would be Tuesday, July 3, 2001. Frankly, I am appalled at this type of attempt in what appears to be an effort to muzzle the citizens of Rosedale and prevent them from having their democratic say. They have a right to make their views known. It is offensive that they would be denied that right by reason of this deadline. I had not intended to write a letter at all until I heard of the July 3 deadline. Many people will want to make submission, who would apparently been denied the right to do so. This all has been caused by the very short time frame in which this development is being pushed onto Rosedale by the Board and by the City.

My impression of the people in Rosedale is that some people support it but that most people do not. My impression of people who live immediately in the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park is that they very much are strongly opposed to the creation of any school in what has become their park.

I understand that the City feels the eastern third of the park that is Zoned P1 was zoned such in error. It would like to address that error was put on official zoning maps of the City and was passed under City bylaws or zoning laws officially. That error was not corrected and it was never advertised to be an error. It may well not have been an error at all. It may have been the intent to create a park specifically at that end of the Neighbourhood Park to complement the wooded tree park and to protect the senior and mature adult housing at the eastern end of that park from immediately school development. Statements have been made that it was an error, apparently in the paper from City officials, but it is not clear to me that it was an error.

Even it were an error, once it was made into an official zoned plan, and given official status under the zoning laws, that error became fixed. People who looked at the zoning map as a basis to rely on before they built their houses or developed their commercial housing developments for sale to the public, would have looked at the map and concluded that the City had passed that portion of the park as P1. They would have been induced to believe by this official map showing the eastern third of the park to be zoned P1 that there would be a park in that portion of the park and not a school, or any other development. In other words, simply put, after that error was made, people relied on it when they built their houses. Regardless at this point whether it was an error or not, people have acted on it because it was the officially adopted zoning policy for that portion of Rosedale. It seems to me irrelevant that it is an error when people were led to believe by officially induced error that there would be a park in that portion of what is now called the Rosedale Community Park (eastern third). The City ought to take responsibility for this error and accept that once people have relied on it and have spent hundreds and thousands of dollars to build their houses, the total of which would run in the tens of millions of dollars probably in total construction value, that it should not be changed now to allow a school. This is the case, in my view at least, even if the area designated P1 was designated in error.

If it was an error, the City could have taken steps to immediately change the error. Those steps were not taken.

There are other points relating to the zoning of this park that to me, at least, from my limited knowledge of the matter, display a history of errors in regard to the advertisement to the public of the purpose for which this park would exist. Statements have been made in the newspaper by City Officials that the other two portions of the park have been always zoned PS (for public school). However, if that were the case, one would think that the signs posted when Rosedale was developed would have shown that a public school was planned for this area. From the knowledge of the people who have built and live there from the beginning, when that park area was developed, the signs posted said that there was "NO SCHOOL" planned for this sub-division. Either the signs were in error when they said that; or the zoning of PS was in error in the first place because no school was planned. Either way, there is a major error in the way that matter was published to the public at the time houses were being constructed. I was not personally living there at the time, but people in Rosedale (at least some of them) say that they have clear memories that the signs posted around that park said that there was no school planned for that area. If that is the case, and those people were led to build their houses based on no school area, then it is a commitment that the City ought to follow now. Either the sign was in error or the zoning of PS in the eastern two-thirds of the park was in error. Either way, the error seemed to have started some time ago at the time the area was first developed.

A second problem is that people who contacted the City were told there was no school planned. Even one of the builders in a professional construction company contacted the City and was told specifically that no school was planned. When people are relying on those verbal statements from knowledgeable City Officials, the City should hold to those statements and keep its promises. Now a builder gets up and says I was told there was no school there. He said he inquired into that from the City and specifically told that. Other people in Rosedale have expressed that they too were told verbally by City Officials that there would be no school built there. If that is the case, given the present statements of the City Officials that it has always been planned for a school, then those statements were an error. That error induced some people to build. Particularly elderly people built there having checked into the fact of whether there would be a school or not, and relying on the representations of City Officials that there would not be a school in that park. Elderly people have been, apparently, been misled to the detriment.

There is a history of errors in regard to the zoning and planning of this area. In saying this, I am only expressing a personal view and nothing more. I realize that I am no privy to technical history of the zoning laws and the history of the development of the planning department of the City and everything that goes into that. I am only writing to you as a resident of Rosedale and as a concerned citizen and in no other capacity.

However, to say now that the only error made was to zone the portion of the park P1 and that a school was always planned for this sub-division is in total contradiction to the fact signs were posted originally that said "NO SCHOOL PLANNED" and the fact that people who inquired of the City were told there was no school planned.

I would respectfully suggest to The Honourable Mayor and the Honourable City Councilors that their responsibility in this matter goes to the fundamental question whether, at this point, nearly 20 years after Rosedale was developed, an area which has become accepted by the community as open green space with soccer fields, skating rink, tennis court, trees, and has been accepted as a park in the heart of our community should now essentially be gutted to allow a large regional school to take its place. Surely the time to build a school was back when the area was built. If not, then it should have been clearly posted, certainly during the time of construction of housing in the adjacent area that a school was always planned for that sub-division. To build a school now would be to rip the heart out of the Rosedale Community by destroying essentially its one large open green space area. I understand through technical analysis that when berms along Highway 11 are included and minor narrow walkways with cinder paths are included, and other very small park areas are included, that statistically Rosedale matches other communities in terms of "green space". However, to compare a berm along Highway 11 with sharp 30-degree angle leading up to a line of trees, down which one can not even walk because there is no sidewalk, to an open park where there is soccer fields is ludicrous. To compare walkways with cinder paths leading between housing to an open park with a skating rink is ludicrous. There is only one large park in Rosedale and that is got a sign on it that says "ROSEDALE NEIGHBOURHOOD PARK". No where, since I have lived in this community for ten years, has there been a sign saying there is going to be a school eventually built on that park. People in this community have come to accept that area as their park. It is the heart of Rosedale in terms of children and the sense that there is some green space in our community. There are other areas of Red Deer such as Deer Park and Morrisroe and perhaps other areas that have more than one large open green space. Why does the School Board have to choose the only open green space in Rosedale to put its school is beyond me. Once that park is gone, Rosedale will be deprived in perpetuity of its one large park. These decisions will affect the community for decades, in fact probably for the next century. Before this type of decision is made, it is my respectful suggestion that City Hall treat it very seriously and sit back and have a good look at what exactly is happening here by the creation of a large middle school in that park.

What will happen is, is that Rosedale will essentially have the heart ripped out of its park and the park that 's left will be just a little of lawn and trees and a skating rink surrounding what is a very large regionally based school.

The very fact that the school is planned to absorb students from outside Red Deer heightens the fact that it is a large school that is proposed. Apparently, children will be bused from Innisfail and Blackfalds to go to this school. I would suggest that there are other and better superior sites available which will not destroy the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park. One site is to the north in what is above College Park or College Heights Sub-Division. It is immediately north of the acreage development north of Highway 11 and east of 30 Avenue, right where the curve is. Right now it is a huge open field. I have seen the zoning map. Zoning approval is already given for the construction of a school there. Why can't it be built there? It's less than a five minute drive from the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park. From the point of view of convenience, it seems to me, equally or more convenient to build it there than in the Rosedale residential area. At least then, people will know that if they are building there, there is a school under construction.

A second area it could be built is to the east of the developed area of Rosedale Meadows as one approaches 20 Avenue. I have noticed that there is essentially a walled city of some sort built called Davenport Place. I have noticed there is a strip mall proposed across the street from that. To the immediate west of that area is a water flood retention pond with a Danger Warning sign posted at eye-level in front of it indicating how fast the water can rise and how dangerous that can be in order to warn people. I see Scott's Gas Bar development there. I see many, many streets of housing. I notice about those houses that they have generally very small back yards. The way these new lots apparently are being developed leave very little green space in people's private back yards. That means that children have to go to a park in order to play soccer or baseball or football, or even just to run around. Some of the lots that have been approved once the houses are on them are hardly much bigger than is necessary to hold a barbecue and a picnic table. Because of the minimum lot sizes, there is even a greater need to have a large green space park in our Rosedale Community. I don't see anywhere to the east of what is already been built on where the City Planners have taken that need into consideration. I don't see where you have planned a large park to replace the one that you apparently plan to approve a school in. Once you destroy that Rosedale Neighbourhood Park with a large Catholic Board middle school, you have apparently envisaged no replacement for that park as development moves to the east. If that is the case, and all that happens further to the east is more housing urban subdivision sprawl, then you will have essentially created a large part of eastern Red Deer with inadequate open park space.

A third area where the school could apparently be built is down in Lancaster Meadows. There are already two large schools there together with the new Recreation Centre. It is certainly logical to build a new middle school in that area. Firstly, the area has not been fully developed and there are already schools there. That site is already approved for a middle school, and that site, to my understanding at least, would be available for the Catholic middle school proposed for Rosedale. Not only is that site approved, that site is closer to the Delburne Highway and is serviced by a four lane major arterial road, namely 30 Avenue to the north south and a four lane arterial road namely 32 Street to the east west. It is a perfect area for major access routes to service. The park in the middle of Rosedale is right in the center of a quiet residential area.

Therefore, I respectfully suggest that any of these three sites would be far superior for the construction of a regionally based middle school than the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park. All three sites are serviced by larger roads. The construction on all three sites has not even begun in two and still under way in Lancaster Meadows. The roads necessary to serve the large number of buses that would serve this large regional school could be built to accommodate the transportation needs.

As it is, Rutherford Drive is a fairly busy and congested street. I hate to imagine what it would be like when school buses are transporting 300 – 600 children to that school every morning and taking them home every afternoon. If there are, say, 15 buses going into that school and each bus makes the trip in and out in the morning, and a trip in and out in the afternoon, the total number of bus passes per day down Rutherford and other areas and the local streets, including Roland Street, would approximate 60 bus passes a

day. That is in addition to the residential traffic that is already there. The suggestion that the traffic impact would be minimal to my way of thinking is attempting to disguise and hide a problem which is obvious on any common sense analysis of the transportation needs of a school of that magnitude.

There is a history to a middle school attempting to be put into the Deer Park area along Davison Drive. Tremendous community opposition rose to object to and oppose that school. The City accommodated and respected the wishes of the residents of that community and chose to not build the school there. This Rosedale issue is, to me, exactly the same as the Deer Park issue. Signs were posted in Rosedale saying there is no school and now it is proposed to build one. The community generally seems to be opposed to the construction of this school as they were in Deer Park. The question that rises is why was Deer Park given the respect due and the school stopped when in Rosedale it seems that the community's wishes are being ignored and the taxpayers are not being respected. One is left with a soured impression that some taxpayers are more important than others. The Rosedale residents, at least in so far as I can understand, are generally opposed to this school just as much as people in Deer Park were. One has to question whether Rosedale is being having a school thrust upon it which was essentially stopped in Deer Park. The point is, that in Deer Park community opposition was sufficient to change people's minds and respect the park space and leave it alone. Why isn't that the same standard for Rosedale? The impression remains that Rosedale residents and taxpayers are being treated on a different standard as was Deer Park.

I have addressed above the concerns of the history of what, at least my view, are planning and zoning mistakes going back to the beginning of this park development in Rosedale, the fact there are equally good or superior sites now available where this middle school could be constructed, and the parallel between the Deer Park situation a few years ago and our present situation in Rosedale.

There are two other points I wish to address.

The first point is that when politicians are elected over a long period of time, the individuals who hold office change. There is a tendency in all politics for people to deal with the immediate short-term problems facing them. I would ask the Honourable Mayor and all the Honourable City Councilors and take a broad long-term perspective on this school issue. I would ask the Learned Council to envisage the eastern portion of Red Deer in the following way. The vision I would suggest is one which leaves the large green space in Rosedale for the needs of the community and its children in perpetuity. It is a beautiful park space. It is invigorating for everyone who lives around it. It is quiet for the seniors who have committed their retirement funds to the very large senior and mature housing development on the east end of the park. Those people particularly believed there would be no school. To build a school there now, in a sense, is to betray the trust of those people. It is not this immediate Council which perhaps is responsible for all the confusion in the past about what was planned or not planned, or what sign was posted and what it said, but overall are the Council which does have the power and the authority to solve this problem in a way that works for the future of the eastern portion of Red Deer. This park could be left alone. It will provide the needed recreational space for the family type of community that it is and the children who use it.

This City needs that type of space in eastern Red Deer. Red Deer has been famous in Alberta for its beautiful park systems. If the type of development that is occurring now in eastern Red Deer continues, eastern Red Deer will be a different story altogether. It will be a crammed suburban sprawl with inadequate open green space. Rosedale has probably one of the highest concentrations of young families with children than any part of Red Deer. Rosedale has one of the more active community associations. It is one of the only neighborhoods in Red Deer that still, for instance, staffs its skating shelter with volunteers. That commitment by the community is very much based upon the existing Rosedale Neighbourhood Park. The City has even put a sign in the park calling it that. People are proud of that park. As the houses are built further to the east, that park will remain for future use for all those persons. If a school is built there now, it will permanently destroy that ambiance, reduce and restrict that green space, and will create an area which is overwhelmingly dominated by a school. The park will become secondary. The seniors will feel a loss of trust. The people who have invested, based upon being advised there would be no school there, will be offended and angered. The community will be deprived of its only large green area. And then the housing will continue to spread eastward. That will go along with the walled development and the strip mall. It will go along with minimal lot sizes. Probably the trees to the east along 20 Avenue will be bulldozed. What will be left?

This Council has the opportunity to re-visit this issue and to put the school in a better location leaving the Rosedale Community Park as an integral open green space in eastern Red Deer in perpetuity. Long term, once this immediate issue of this proposed zoning amendment is defeated, if it is defeated, then the alternatives can be discussed between the City and the Catholic School Board; an alternate site of which there are at least three can be chosen for the development of that school in the very near future. The Catholic School Board will be little inconvenienced by whether it builds the school in Lancaster, further east of Rosedale Meadows, or north in College Park. The community of Rosedale will be forever damaged by its construction in the heart of our park. That is irreversible. The proportionate balance between the damage to the community and the inconvenience to the School Board, to me at least, leads to the conclusion that the park should be left as is and eventually be rezoned to be park and the school should be constructed in one of the alternate sites. In other words, I would ask the Council to employ the vision of green space in Red Deer that is at the heart of this community's fame across Alberta.

The second point which I would ask you to consider is the sense of respecting the democratic wishes of the people who live in Rosedale. Their impression, I would say at this time, is that their interests are being run roughshod over and are being brushed aside based on technical zoning arguments and pre-stated positions declared by the leaders of the community over which they have no say. It is true that there is a zoning designation of PS in part of the park that was passed in a more general east hill plan. However, the City's own procedure for mailing out these zoning changes or advertising them specifically to the area affected around the Rosedale park was not followed according to what one of the City's spokesman said at the meeting held at Holy Family School on Tuesday, June 26, 2001. It was admitted that the procedure was deficient in that the local people affected by the change to school from K to 9 were not specifically notified. That is another error in the way this matter has been handled. Surely the City

has a responsibility to respect what the community wants. Surely these decisions don't need to be made so quickly and the citizens left with a feeling that their concerns were basically pushed aside, run roughshod over as the school is quickly constructed. One of the symbolic things that has happened was that immediately after funding was announced, even before the meeting on June 26, surveyors were already surveying the site. When people point out that it is zoned P1, the declaration is made that, well then, we'll build the school in the other end of the park. Essentially, if people in Rosedale seriously don't want this school, and there are other places to build this school, then why is everybody pushing so hard against something that the people do not want? Politicians are elected to respect the wishes of the people they serve. When there is a history of what appears to be little glitches and mistakes along the way, it is my respectful comment that the wishes of the residents of Rosedale should be listened to; that they should be given sufficient time to make their submissions and to be heard with out arbitrary deadlines such as July 3, that if the opposition to the school is real and wide spread, that alternate sites should be considered even if they are inconvenient to the Board or to the City. And most importantly, the families with children and the community looking forward into the future should recognize the need to maintain and preserve what has become accepted as a large park in the heart of Rosedale.

This park has been there for years. The area developed around it. The area is now stabilized around the park. To go back now and say, well, it was zoned school 17 years ago so now we're going to build it, just disregards the evolution and dynamic development of this community. It may have been planned for a school then, but since then it has certainly turned into a park. Even the City accepted that it was a park. Statements were made that there would be no school built there.

I urge the City Councilors and the Honourable Mayor to reconsider this entire issue and take the following steps:

1. To turn down the immediate zoning application for the portion of the Rosedale Community Park that is presently zoned P1 for which there is amendment pending to change it to PS zoning to allow school construction in the eastern part of the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park;
2. To table this discussion to a later date in the fall in order to allow a committee of the City to hear from the residents and to incorporate this issue into a longer range vision of the development of eastern Rosedale and what follows east as the development moves toward 20 Avenue and perhaps even beyond;
3. To address whether there is adequate large open park space in our area;
4. And to consider eventually re-zoning the portions of the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park that are presently zoned for a PS (for school) to change them to a designation of P1 (for park). It is time to change the zoning to conform to what is there, namely a beautiful park serving all of the community in eastern Rosedale and beyond in perpetuity and to respect the vision of Red Deer as a City of parkland mixed in with its development.

I wish to emphasize at the end of this letter that all the comments I have made are made with the greatest of respect to Her Worship the Mayor, to all the Honourable City Councilors, to all the hard working and honest people in the planning and zoning departments of the City, to the hard working and capable senior people in the Catholic School Board. I recognize personally, that everybody is simply trying to do the best job they can. I would say that my letter is intended as positive constructive suggestion and as an expression of my personal view. My letter intends no criticism of anyone and I only know that everyone here involved in this decision is motivated with good intentions.

I would like to express my disappointment with the proposed zoning change which would ultimately allow for a middle school to be constructed in Rosedale. My main reason for my disapproval is the large increase in traffic that would occur. The Rosedale neighbourhood park is situated in the middle of the community, therefore there is no access via a major route. Residential streets that are already crowded due to older houses with no garages (mainly on the west entrance) would be in effect clogged due to the increased busing and traffic through accesses such as Roland Street. The end result is a major safety concern for traffic and children. This school is planned as a regional school by the Catholic board, which means that it will be housing children from the north side and rural areas therefore increasing bus demands from what a "community" school would require. With other areas that have not been yet developed (College Park, Lancaster...) with access from major arterial roads I believe there is a better location for this proposed structure.

I believe that most people would agree that children are of a different attitude than 10 years ago. I know that all children/teens are not vandals nor should they be tagged as vandals but children/teens appear to be more brazen now a days. With Rosedale having one of the lowest crime rates in Red Deer, adult living complexes directly to the east of the proposed site and a forested area across the street from the site with additional adult housing directly behind creates a major concern regarding vandalism and mischief.

Lack of conscientiousness towards the residents around the park and in the immediate area is also very concerning. With the construction of the proposed school, the values of the residences in the immediate area will drop significantly. The homes in the immediate area are new, luxurious homes with current values upwards of \$300,000. Construction of such homes around the Rosedale neighbourhood park were appealing due to the aesthetics the park provided and that city planning stating that this area would never accomodate a school (ie. the \$275,000 duplex on the east side of the park owned by a 78 year old gentleman). Although the school board has declared that the building plan would be "the very pleasing to the eye from Reichley Street" there has been no mention of how eye pleasing it would be for the other 3 sides of the park.

There is additional issues that I am concerned about such as the removal of the playground equipment, the part of the park that would be left for the residents is the low side that houses the storm sewer (after large storms and spring melt our

children would not have an adequate area to play in), and where are our children supposed to play during lunch hours when school is out? These concerns are secondary to my major concerns but still require attention.

I am aware that schools need to be erected for both the Catholic and Public systems but I believe that there are better locations. I hope my concerns will be read, validated and addressed.

Prior to purchasing this house, I went to the City of Red Deer to check on plans for this area. The land east of the park was zoned "Urban". Located close to the shelter was a sign indicating that "no new schools were proposed for this area". It was on these grounds that I purchased my house to learn in the early 90's the city had decided to add a elementary school site on the park. When I served as President of the community association, this site was held by the Red Deer Public School Board as an elementary school site. This site was later turned over to the city as the public school board did not require this site. Sometime later the Red Deer Catholic School Board decided they would like to have the site for a future elementary school. In 1997, unknown to residents, the City zoned this land for a K to 9 junior high school.

It is very unfortunate that a resident cannot rely on elected officials to protect residents from arbitrarily rezoning land in an established community. A community where residents have made it their home. Both City Council and the Catholic School Board Trustees have taken this park away from our children and the community. Building a junior high school on a residential street adjacent to a park used by many young children is poor planning and done with little consideration for our community. My name is Jeff Strong and I am writing to you on behalf of myself and my wife Heather to express our whole-hearted disapproval of the planned school for our community.

We disapprove of this school being built for the following reasons:

1. The area proposed for this school was designated P1 and requires a change to P2.

Please explain to us, why would City Council and the Red Deer Catholic School Board consider doing this when other areas, College Park and Lancaster, both have sites that would be appropriate for this application?

2. When my wife and I purchased our property we were aware that a PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL might be built on the proposed location and we were quite content with that knowledge. Were we misled? Did we purchase our property after being provided with FALSE INFORMATION?
3. Rosedale is one of the largest communities in Red Deer yet, we have the least amount of green space. Our park as it is now is fully utilized by the large number of families that reside in our community. With the large family base of our community we would think that City Council and the Red Deer Catholic School Board could see that the park as it is, a place for entertainment, exercise and recreation is not only a pleasant amenity but a requirement.
4. With HOLY FAMILY SCHOOL already zoned and capable of accommodating a middle school, in addition to appropriate sites being available in College Park and Lancaster, why would City Council and the Red Deer Catholic School Board wish to disrupt the young family oriented community that has been established in Rosedale?

5. At the present time, all MIDDLE SCHOOLS in Red Deer are situated on MAJOR ARTERIAL ROADS. Why would City Council and the Red Deer Catholic School Board make a decision that would increase traffic flow in an area NOT ON A MAJOR ARTERIAL ROAD, and cause concern and possible grief for parents in regards to the safety of their children? The potential site in College Heights is undeveloped and roads could be designed to accommodate traffic flow and community safety concerns during the planning stages.
6. With any middle school there also arises the specter of VANDALISM! The potential for lack of respect for nearby property owners and congestion considerations are much greater with a MIDDLE SCHOOL than with an ELEMENTARY SCHOOL. Dear Mr. Dornstauder;

Before providing specifics, I will stand forward to say that my family (and many others in the Rosedale) are in favor of a school in our park site area (as to whether it should be a K-5, K-9, or 6-9 school remains open to debate). It is important to note that the representation of the beliefs and interests were severely skewed at the June 26 meeting. Clearly, given that the invitation was to discuss the proposed design of a school (and not its proposed "presence"), your meeting attracted mostly the opposed. I suspect that if the meeting were to discuss the latter, you would have seen a significantly different (and perhaps more balanced) representation of interests. Below are my comments and suggestions regarding what was expressed at the June 26, 2001 community meeting at the Holy Family Elementary School.

The facts...

- Before building and moving to the Rosedale area in 1996, my family lived in Eastview Estates. When we decided to search for a new home to grow our young family, we investigated the planning of the Rosedale area (via the City Engineering Dept.). We discovered that a portion of the park green area under question was slated as a proposed public elementary school site. Although there were no guarantees that a school would be built in any given time frame, it was clear that a school was possible. While we do not know for how long but a sign to this effect was posted along the north end of the park green area in 1996. At the time, given the young demographics of the Rosedale area (one need only to drive around on a weekend afternoon to see the mass number of children in the area and/or count the number of driveway basketball hoops), the geographic location of schools around Red Deer, and the future plans of not only the Rosedale Meadow area but also the entire East side of Red Deer, my family chose to locate in Rosedale since the probability of some form of school existing sometime in the future was high.
- After moving to Rosedale, we have heard nothing formally about any school plans until recent. As the public school system continued to close selected elementary schools, there was no indication whether or not the plan for a future school for the Rosedale area would be abandoned (thereby turning the proposed site into park). When the school lands were sold to the Catholic Regional Division, again there was no indication whether or not a school would be built. While none of this was ever formally communicated to my family (by anyone, including the Rosedale Community Association) we were able, just the same, able to learn all via local newspapers, City Council meetings, and general community "gossip". At no time were we ever misled to believe that there would or would not be a school in the area.
- Those who feel they were misled by the verbal statements of others can be sympathized with. However, the real truth is in the planning documents and official meeting minutes of the City of Red Deer and the Parkland Planning Commission, not what any builder, realtor, or any other unofficial body may say. Even if statements from reputable individuals are provided, one must still consider that these are still opinions until validated by factual documentation. Clearly, there must be a planning process for all that happens in our communities. In no way, shape, or form should there be a diversion from this process without thorough debate and clear rationale. If opinion can alter the course of an established and focused planning process, then all is nothing more than an academic exercise. Realtors and developers will often say whatever is necessary to make a sale. At best, few engage in sufficient research to ensure that their statements are accurate. If you were to query all of the builders who built Rosedale homes, I suspect that most were well aware that a school could one day be proposed for the area. I suspect also that most realtors will reluctantly tell you the same.
- Most of those adamantly opposed to the presence of a school are those who live along the perimeter of the park area. What they are most concerned about is not the presence of a school but rather a physical obstruction to their accustomed "view" of their surroundings. Since many have enjoyed the absence of any major public structure for more than a decade, they have quite simply forgotten that a school has always been a possibility for the area. As for the "view of the mountains...", as a home owner with an unobstructed view to the west, there is no such view!
- While not directly related to the aforementioned points, this point is most certainly fact. Regardless of right or wrong, correct process or flawed, what is abundantly clear is that communication regarding this proposal was terrible and less than professional. Regardless of whether one is for or against, clear and frequent communication is a must. As an engineer, I plan, implement, and execute nothing without exhaustive communication with all stakeholders. While I will not place blame anywhere specific, each individual involved in the planning and proposal of this school (planners, engineers, teachers, administrators, councilors, etc.) needs to take better responsibility. As mentioned in the opening, I am in favor of a school but what kind of school will it be? First it was a public elementary. Then a Catholic K-5. Then a Catholic K-9. Now a Catholic 6-9. Effective communication throughout all stages of the planning process would have eliminated this question. Communicate often. Communicate well. Communicate openly.

The fiction...

- Those who are worried that their property values will suffer may be justified if they live in the adult community area. However, statistics show that the presence of a local school can increase property values, especially for families like mine who are willing to pay a little extra for the comforts and benefits of a nearby school. Perhaps the lesson to be learned here is to carefully plan the proximity of adult communities to proposed school sites.
- Those who are worried about area vandalism and “immoral behaviors” are very misinformed. While vandalism is often done well away from ones area of residence, if 50%+ of the students for your proposed school will be bused to/from external communities, the majority of vandalism and the like will most probably be of local authorship: the children who are present in the area. The presence or absence of a school is of little influence.
- Those worried about traffic and parking don't seem to be too worried about the amount that occurs each morning as people heading to the chemical plants to the east take shortcuts through Rosedale to Highway 11. They also don't seem to be concerned about the number of people who park along the affect streets during soccer games and other large gatherings in the park area. A school parking lot or an interior school road loop will significantly reduce the number of visitors parking on the main street. As for traffic, middle schools have perhaps the least amount of traffic since many students are mature enough to walk to school (if within reasonable distance) yet are not old enough to drive themselves.

While the comments and suggestions presented represent those of my family alone, I suspect that if you were to carefully survey all of the Rosedale residents, that you will discover that many of my comments will be echoed. While an elementary school is perhaps what should be built (given that the term “elementary” has always been the reference throughout the major of the planning process), the greatest benefit to my children would be a middle school. Regardless of my opinion, please consider the following requests:

1. Stay with the planning process. Do not enable the opinion and threats of a few destroy the benefit for the majority. This is a precedent you do not want to set. Most of us did our homework as we planned our lives for this community area. So did you. Too bad for those who did not. The presence of a school will improve our community in terms of who it serves, the facilities it offers, and our children's futures. The quality and care of what we sow today will serve as testament to what grows tomorrow.
2. Carefully and thoroughly survey everyone in the Rosedale area (in particular those to the east of Rutherford). This means door-to-door, person-to-person. Ensure you get all the facts and opinions in such a way that they are statistically factual and defensible. The Rosedale Community Association has recently been going door-to-door seeking petition signatures. They did not come to anyone I am aware of in my area (Revie Close). I suspect they only considered the park perimeter homes. We who were missed need to be heard.
3. Hold another open public forum and solicit the presence of supporters. If one considers the likely election of a very popular political candidate, the fears of the candidate are that complacency will set in by those who would vote in favor but fail not to vote since they assume that will be enough support of others to warrant their absence. This is perhaps the impression of many who did not attend the June 26 meeting as it was a meeting whose invitation letter clearly implied that a school was a given. I almost did not attend. I'm glad I did.

Mr. Olson has been building in Red Deer for many years. He knows that he can get "up-to-date" information from many sources. If a school was such a concern to his clients, he owed it to them to cover his bases a little more thoroughly than making a phone call to a friend. The "beef" from Ritson Cl. residents is with Mr. Olson not the Catholic School Board.

Education was a big issue in the last Provincial election- a cry for more funding and smaller classes. If you don't build schools, how are you going to have smaller classes?

Rosedale now has a chance to have a school. The funding is in place, the architectural plans are available. City council should have no problem re-zoning the area in question. It was a city clerical error. The correction for this should come from the city- no question. How could City Council turn down what appears to be an up-to-date, modern, nine million dollar school.

There is now a petition circulating with the goal of nixing the school because it wasn't zoned properly. You can put it under whatever category suits you, but you really aren't interested in education when your priorities are to try and stop a school from being built. How can some Rosedale residents work so hard to squash a school in this area, or any area. The opposed citizens in Rosedale got thirty canvassers in one night. I'm sure that the Heart and Stroke Foundation would love to have that list of eager canvassers.

For Rosedale residents busing their children out to other school districts, I hope your children are treated with more respect than the children about to enter the Rosedale system.

Strong opposition is coming from the adult community located east of the school. Many names on the petition will be from this area. I think 80% of the adult community would have grandchildren. They must attend school in some district. Your opposition to the school says " I raised my children right", but my children didn't raise the grandchildren right.

The world vandalism is used frequently in opposition to the school. Vandalism is not something that has sprung up in the last ten years. In the 1970's and '80's we had a school set on fire three times, we had large scale damage to another school during the construction. It is not a new issue that only applies to the children of today.

Traffic and location are concerns. The location is good for a middle school. Elementary schools bring a lot of traffic. Middle schools bring foot traffic along with six buses in the morning and six buses at school closing. The buses could enter from highway 11

and Ross street and proceed to Reichley street, do the bus loop at the school and leave the same way. I think that this is a location that disturbs very little of the community traffic-wise.

The Catholic School Board held a meeting at Holy Family School to present Rosedale residents with information and a model of the school. People didn't listen and few viewed the model of the proposed school. A table was set up at the school entrance with a group of people asking you to sign a petition opposing the school. This was BEFORE the presentation. How can you make an educated decision if you sign the petition and then listen to the presentation. It was pretty much a close minded session.

This petition covered many homes, obtained many signatures, some people signed saying "It really doesn't concern me but I'll sign it anyway".

The negative releases to the press are a strike against the Rosedale Community district. It will be known as the district that vetoed a school ,at all costs. You have managed to split the community, and Rosedale will never return to being the community it once was.

To the opposed , the "not in my backyard policy" I have to say that we would be proud to have our grandchildren in our backyard any time! To those of you looking to hear from influential people, I have spent many years getting my S.C.P.G. degree. That stands for " Senior Citizen, Proud Grandparent! Will I do?



RE: PROPOSED ROSEDALE SCHOOL

We would like to share our thoughts on the proposed Rosedale school. We support the rezoning of the park area and the building of a school for any age.

We purchased our lot and had our house built in Rosedale in 1995. At that time, we were well aware that a school was planned for our neighbourhood. When the option to build on the school site changed hands from one school district to another, we were aware of that also. Because the Rosedale extension was largely vacant when we moved in, we made it our priority to stay informed of developments in our neighbourhood. Access to accurate, up-to-date information was not difficult. We have found City of Red Deer staff knowledgeable, considerate and willing to assist us. Over the years, we have inquired about streetlights, area maps, speed limits, garbage pickup and the school site.

As new Rosedale residents, we have attended as many community association meetings as we have been able. Of the meetings we have attended over the past 6 years, attendance has been low, never exceeding 20 people. Greg Scott represented the City of Red Deer at some of those meetings, dutifully posting future plans for Rosedale on the walls and available to answer questions and address concerns. Very few residents took advantage of these opportunities to educate themselves regarding plans for the neighbourhood.

When the Catholic School Board received approval for this project, we were pleased. A middle school in our neighbourhood presented many positives. We were excited at the thought that the school may house courses, drop-in sports and meeting space. Our 3 children currently attend St. Patrick's Community School, and prior to our move to year-round schooling when it became available 3 years ago, our children attended Holy Family School for 6 years. We are very familiar with the procedures in the Catholic School District and have been very pleased with our children's experiences. If we should decide to return our children to a traditional calendar school, 2 of them would be eligible to attend the proposed Rosedale school. Our oldest just finished grade 9.

We have two concerns regarding the recent uprising of opposition to the school:

Our first concern centers on personal responsibility. As community members, we have made it our priority to stay informed of developments in our community. Progress on the

school site has not been a surprise to us. We believe that some of our neighbours may have received misleading information regarding the school site; however, we believe this number is very small. Information gathering is not a passive process –it is a process that requires us to take some initiative in asking questions and seeking answers. We believe many of the now dissatisfied Rosedale residents reneged on their personal responsibility to access accurate information regarding development in this community. An investment of \$200,000+ should warrant much investigation on the part of the investor.

Our second concern is regarding the current behaviour and attitudes of some Rosedale residents.

We are extremely disheartened at the concerns expressed regarding the negative impact a school would have in our neighbourhood. Many residents have jumped on the “Opposition Bandwagon”, even though they had prior knowledge of the school.

Concerns regarding traffic have been blown entirely out of proportion. We feel the city planners and school board representatives have adequately addressed these concerns. At the public meeting, unfortunately, it appears many people attended to speak and not to listen. Homeowners who buy or build on through streets (or collector roads) must expect that traffic will increase as the community grows. Homeowners with serious traffic concerns buy or build in more secluded locations, and usually pay more for that choice.

Concerns regarding vandalism are equally overblown. We have had acts of vandalism in the past and will continue to have in the future. We attended a Rosedale Community Association meeting where there was an attempt to broaden the Neighbourhood Watch program beyond the 3 blocks that were participating at the time. No one came forward to coordinate the program.

Many residents claim they don't want to lose any green space. We suspect that most residents across the city would like more green spaces in their neighbourhood. We, too, think that having a 13-acre front yard paid for by the City would be a wonderful asset; however, the school site has always been in the Rosedale plan. The school year has 190 teaching days; this leaves 175 days per year that there will be no one attending the school.

Should the proposed school in Rosedale not proceed because of the opposition, we believe two important messages will be sent to the public:

Message #1:

Long-range city and school board planning is irrelevant. A powerful precedent will be set by allowing residents who are having second thoughts about a school nearby dictate the direction of the city as a whole. “No school in Rosedale” doesn't equate to “no new school”. Very few residents bought or built without knowledge of the proposed school. If Rosedale residents can ban schools from their neighbourhood, other communities will have the same opportunity. **Where will we build our schools?** Will our children be bussed to schools sitting out in the middle of undeveloped land so not one will have to put up with them? Will the residents in Lancaster or College Heights be more tolerant of our

children than the people of Rosedale? We thought we lived in a family-friendly community; however, it appears we're trading adult-living for middle school children. There is no reason that seniors and youth cannot peacefully co-exist in Rosedale.

Message #2:


We expect our children to misbehave. This message has been repeated in many forms over the past week. The alarmist mentality that has overtaken many Rosedale residents is appalling. We have attended, assisted and chaperoned many school-related and extra-curricular events with our children. The vast majority of young people we have come into contact with are interesting, exciting, intelligent and respectful people. Similarly, so are most of the adults we come into contact with. Concerns about groups of young people hanging around, damaging property, smoking drugs and fighting are unfounded. Do these activities occur among middle school students – yes. Often – no. Do these activities occur among adults – yes. Often – no. What are we afraid of? That our young people will behave exactly as we did when we were that age?! Responsible adults tolerated us, some of them even nurtured and guided us through those years. We were not forced into isolation until we “grew up”.

We walk through our neighbourhood almost every night, sometimes as early as 9:00 p.m., sometimes as late as midnight. We've seen those middle school students; oh yes, they're already in our neighbourhood. They're shooting hoops, racing around remote-controlled vehicles, biking, rollerblading and “hanging out” with their friends. They deliver our newspaper and babysit for our neighbours. They ring our doorbell fundraising for their own activities.

Transition can be a tough time - for young people and for young neighbourhoods. It can also be a rewarding time. Some people feel threatened by change, others see opportunity.

Please promote healthy communities. Approve and encourage schools where our youth can intermingle with the residents, learn about respectful community living and even teach us a few things in the process!

Your smear campaign in the neighborhood and in the press reflects a bad image of the Rosedale Community as a whole. We moved to this area ,and so did many other family's because we were told there would be a K-9 school at that park. A K-9 school includes middle school. Most of us don't feel that we need to publicly announce that we are for the school. We feel that the Catholic Board has done it's job and all the issues were handled correctly. The people who support this school in this area would be considerably less than the very vocal opposition, because of the large number of seniors and non Catholics involved.

The facts are simple. The Catholic School Board obtained the school site in late 1997 from the Public School Board. Your comments and suggestions regarding the Rosedale Middle School:

We bought our property 7 years ago knowing full well that a school was going to be built on this location. It was our understanding that it was to be an elementary school of approximately 300 students for the Public school board. In 1998 we were informed that the public school board did not require the property and that the Catholic School board was going to build there instead. We were not informed of the change to a middle school or the more than doubling of the student population. We would not have built at this location if any indication that this type of School would be built were given to us. The building of this school and the results of this meeting have prompted the following comments,

Traffic

The Riechly/Roland combination is an extremely busy corridor with a certain percentage of people circumventing the traffic light at 30th Ave. and highway 11 through Rosedale Estates. In the case of any home based business application or commercial development traffic is always raised as one of the most prevalent concerns. These concerns almost always prompt a traffic study. Has or would the Catholic school board consider a thorough traffic assessment with full disclosure to the residents of Rosedale.

The board administrator had indicated that approximately 60% of the students would be bussed to the new school. This would require approximately 6 buses. This is in addition to the 4 buses that currently run through our neighborhood during the school year. While it is true that there would be a loss of maybe 2 buses this still almost doubles the bus traffic through our neighborhood.

Environment

As with any major development the school should be subjected to an environmental impact assessment. I can find no where in the City of Red Deer that a school has been built this close to a historical park or environmental reserve. Lindsay Thurber and Camille were built long before the Kerrywood Nature area was designated as such. In fact as students both Lindsay Thurber and Camille ran cross-country through the preserve. In the case of the historical park in the Rosedale area, vandalism and potential destruction is a very real possibility with the increase traffic the school is sure to bring. Pessimistically speaking I don't think that your environmental studies group will be able to restore the historical significance once the damage has been done. Yes the children of our community use and abuse this area as well but they are not an extra several hundred students bussed into our community with little or know attachment to it.

I have lived in close proximity to a school for several years prior to building in Rosedale. I have found the litter and garbage to be a constant nuisance and saw little or no response from the school to help clean up the neighboring streets and yards.

With our major employer changing to a more shift work (does not affect myself) the issue of noise pollution must be considered. As I will be across the park from the school the idea of having to listen to recess bells, clanging flag poles and the din coming from a school yard full of kids will most certainly affect my personal environment. The noise issue maybe lessened somewhat with a middle school but it will most certainly bring its own type of noise.

School Design

I truly believe that the Catholic School board will do as it well pleases when it comes to the design of the school, community be damned. I like the design where the busses are taken off the street and drop off the students in the back of the school. I believe that this will relieve some of the pressure on Roland Street and is safer in general. I would like to see a buffer of large trees separating the bus lane from the park as a repayment for taking more of our precious green space.

In summary we are very angry that we were not kept informed of the changes in the school designation. It is not so much that the school had been changed to a middle school as that all appearances are that the community has been lied to. **THAT WILL NEVER BE ACCEPTED!!** I found the arrogance of the board members to be very abrasive and not conducive to good public relations. Their poor communication only encouraged the meeting to become heated. I am placing this on a different form simply because of the last sentence on your comment sheet. It states that the sheet is collected for use in providing input into the design of the Rosedale Middle School. Is this more arrogance on the Catholic School Boards part. You must remember that you have not even received proper zoning or final approval as yet.

Before purchasing my home in July, 1999, my realtor gave me an unscaled drawing, produced and printed by Parkland Community Planning, illustrating how the weed-covered parkland directly in front of the house was to be developed. It showed that there would be a Class A Sportfield within the parkland catchment area running parallel with Raabis Street, and beyond in the south-east corner, there could be an elementary school not to exceed 3 acres. I purchased my home accepting that there might be an elementary school within the 13+ acres of the parkland.

In early June of this year my husband and I were informed by a member of the Rosedale Community Association that the status of the school that is to be built on the parkland has changed from elementary to junior high. We were most annoyed that there had been no official notification of this change, and no opportunity to voice our concerns. Why not? Later we asked at City Hall for the updated plans for our parkland. We were shown a drawing identical to the Parkland Community Planning drawing that my realtor had given to me three summers ago. City Hall had no other plan. Again, why not?

We blame City Hall and Parkland Community Planning for much of the ugly situation in which we, the residents of Rosedale, find ourselves. However, the School Board lost good will when one of its own dictated to his audience that there will be a school built in Rosedale.

We do not want a middle school (6-9) on the Rosedale park. We would not object to an elementary school should it not exceed 3 acres, which was the original proposal for the school area.

I was looking forward to help out in the school, if one is to be built, but only with the K to 5 classes. All my



Please accept the following as comments regarding the proposal of a middle school being built in Rosedale.

When we built our home in 1986 in Rosedale, we did so under the basis of a public elementary school being built in the area. We, at the time did not have children, but thought it would be great to have an elementary school in our neighborhood so that our future children could attend. A few years later, a sign was erected on the park site indicating no school was designated for this area. We have lived under the assumption for many years that there would be no school built in this area. We were completely unaware that the site had been changed from being an elementary school site to a middle school site.

We are completely opposed to a middle school being built in this area. We would have not chosen to build our home in Rosedale if this had been indicated at that time. I feel that the change from a elementary school to a middle school was not well advertised and that people in the Rosedale community should have been made aware of this proposal of change.

At the meeting June 26, 2001 many people present were also unaware that changes had occurred to allow a middle school to be built in the Rosedale park.

I would request that the Catholic School board and City Council rethink building a middle school in Rosedale. A school should be built into a community right from the onset and not placed within an existing mature

community. Changing the rules after the game has been played is completely unfair and do it in such a way that the players were unaware of the changed rules is cheating.

It was indicated at the meeting that changing the site from an elementary site to a middle school site had occurred through a correct process. If it was so correct than why are the members of the Rosedale community so surprised that the planning has gotten as far as it has without their knowing of it. The first I heard of this was when it was announced that the Catholic School board had received funding to build a new middle school and the proposed site was Rosedale (spring 2001).


I went to the meeting to address the issue of a middle school being built in the area and to vote down this proposal. Not to vote on which architectural school plan I liked best.

I would like to express my disappointment regarding the proposed middle school in the Rosedale area.

The major reason is primarily due to the traffic increase that will occur. All other middle schools in Red Deer are situated on major arteries that can accomodate the traffic flows. However, because there is no major arteries the traffic will greatly increase on the residential streets. Alot of the residences on the west side of the park have no garages which in turn means they park on the street. With this school being proposed as a regional school that in turn means more traffic than a community school due to increased busing required. Therefore with increased traffic on already crowded streets makes for a major safety concern.

Although kids will be kids, everyone agrees that children are not of the same attitude as children 10 years ago. I know not all children/teens are vandals but they are certainly more "brazen". So for a school that is proposed in a community with a very low crime rate and with adult living to the east of the school it is a major concern.

My last concern is the lack of conscientiousness towards the residents directly around the park and in the immediate area. Most residents built where they did due to the large green space and aesthetics the park provided. With the city always mandating it would always be a park and never would a school reside there it seemed like an excellent location for construction. However, with the construction of a school, all the homes will signicantly drop in value(Most of which are \$200,000 - \$280,000). If the school had been built a couple of years (NOT 16 years) after Rosedale was established, then the current residents who have recently purchased their homes would possibly not be so upset because THEY WOULD HAVE KNOWN THEY WERE BUYING CLOSE TO A SCHOOL.

It seems frustrating not to have these questions answered:

Would it not be less traumatic to established communities if schools were built in newer areas and the houses built around them? Was this not done around the Hunting Hills and Notre Dame schools? Were not the two high schools already being built before some the houses were even started in that area?

Comments:

The public knew they were buying lots and building houses close to two high schools because the schools went up first and many houses have followed. Comments re Rosedale Middle School

We have lived at the above address since 1986. We chose to purchase our lot and build our home knowing there would be a park and a "potential" school across the street (K - 6). Shortly afterward there were signs erected all around to tell us there would be NO SCHOOL. As time passed and our kids went to school we came to know what living beside a school would mean in terms of traffic, noise and loss of park space - we were relieved to know there would be no school. We took the signs at their word. It frankly never occurred to us that the signs had been erected to prevent the city from getting too much pressure from area residents to build a school (as Mr. Meyette said). This admission implies a deliberate attempt to mislead and is abominable. From our perspective, our issue on this is with the city and not with the school board. We stand on our assertion that there should be NO SCHOOL not just no middle school. We were duped, as were other residents (some even more than us).

Our issue with the Catholic School Board is that the residents were never approached directly about your intent to build any school. As you said at the meeting you did nothing wrong and didn't try to slide anything past anyone. Fine, we will take you at your word on this. It is, however, mind boggling that you would continue to stand on this knowing how much opposition you have.

Specifically, we were let down by your approach to the meeting. You and the city would have fared better with some display of contrition, an apology and a commitment to slow the process down to give everyone a chance to state their case, do some research (i.e. what really will happen to property values, a survey of homeowner who presently reside within a 2 block radius of schools to show their feelings about living near the school including information on the family income, socio-economic status, ages of children, value of home, etc.) My point is not even that a survey like this should be conducted but rather that you should or could have done any number of things like this to prepare for the meeting. **The fact that you didn't was insulting** and people became very rude (I was not one of them). The end result of the meeting would have not been much different because people don't want a school but you would have 'come off' a lot better than you did and people would have been calmer.

Our feeling on what you should have done aside, we still want NO SCHOOL. It is inappropriate to put a school on a collector road. You should know this. Even if the city has said they are now putting schools on collectors, you should use your considerable power and resources to lobby against this i.e. request the city produce studies from other municipalities showing data on collectors vs. arterials.

It is shortsighted and ludicrous to suggest that we can increase the population on the area by 500 - 600 people 5 days per week with no deleterious affects. This area IS NOT the place for your school. Follow the example of Hunting Hills and Notre Dame -- that is, build the school then build the subdivision. This, and only this, option will afford everyone the opportunity to make fully informed decisions that benefit all.

I wish to make known my support for the proposed school in Rosedale Meadows.

My husband and I purchased our lot in Rosedale in 1998, knowing that this site was being considered for a new school. We were hoping that this site would be chosen for the location of a new Catholic school, and are very pleased that funding has been granted.

Opposition for this site on the basis of not knowing about a school designation is unwarranted as the subdivision plan indicated a possible school site and signage was also erected. To my knowledge, there was no indication of the type of school that was to be built. Who could know this information 3 years ago?

Opposition for this school on the basis that senior's and mature housing is adjacent to the site is similarly bogus. Since when are seniors supposed to be kept separate from children? Is there some sort of apartheid operating in the City of Red Deer based on age? Deer Park has senior's duplexes built right next to Holy Family School, *after the school was operating*, despite the desire of many residents, myself included, to keep the area in question zoned for single family housing. Senior's fear of vandalism from students in the school bespeaks a prejudice against young people that is both unfair and unfortunate. A better solution would be to get seniors into our schools with their wealth of experience and patience to help young students. Perhaps all parties would get to understand and respect each other.



Land Use Amendment**

On behalf of the 700 plus Rosedale electors who hereby petition City Council to refuse to grant approval to the zoning change for the eastern portion of the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park from P1 to PS, I request that our attached petition be placed on the agenda for the Public Hearing Monday, July 16th, 2001, of the Council Meeting.

Our immediate concern is to block the construction of the Catholic Middle School 6-9 proposed for the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park by the Red Deer Catholic Regional Division No. 39. Our long term goal is the preservation of the entire Rosedale Neighbourhood Park for the present and future recreation needs of all Rosedale residents.

Our reasons for petitioning City Council to refuse to approve the zoning change for the eastern portion of the park include the following:

1. Residents of Rosedale were not properly notified of a change from elementary school site to a K-9 school site.
2. A sign was not erected indicating the Rosedale Neighbourhood Park consisted of a K-9 School site by the Red Deer Catholic Regional Division No. 39 as set out in the City Guidelines.
3. Other more suitable sites for a K-9 Catholic school exist in Red Deer with better access to arterial roads for the busing of rural students and students from Kentwood, Normandeau, Pines, Glendale, and Fairview. The proposed Rosedale Middle School will be placed only 2.8 km away from the only other Catholic middle school serving Red Deer.
4. Concerns that a school housing approximately 600 students would cause an increase in traffic on already heavily used collector roads to beyond what is recommended for these roads.
5. The Rosedale Neighbourhood Park is now complete with sports fields and recreation facilities that are now heavily utilized by children of the community of Rosedale as well as other communities. With the increase in high density homes in Phase III, there will be a greater demand on the use of these recreational facilities. Rosedale presently has 10% greenspace of which only one park exists with sports fields. This 10% greenspace includes the berms to the north, south and west of Rosedale.
6. Concern for the adjacent natural habitat park and a large adult community where most residents are retired seniors.

Rosedale School Site Background Material

1. Why is The City of Red Deer providing this Q & A Backgrounder?

There has been a lot of attention and information surrounding the Rosedale school site. The City has put together this Q & A Backgrounder to provide clarification to this issue.

2. Is The City required to designate land for school sites?

Yes, under the Municipalities Act cities must plan for schools. The City of Red Deer also has a signed agreement with the school boards requiring The City to provide school sites. Based on the standards of the Community Services Master Plan school sites are designed into the area park plan that is prepared by the Recreation, Parks and Culture Department in collaboration with both Red Deer school boards.

Once The City has designated school locations, it is up to the school board to decide what type of school to build based on community needs and grade allocation. Because of their size requirements, high schools are specifically designated in the Area Structure Plan.

3. Why is Council being asked to rezone land that was originally designated for a school?

Potential school and park sites are usually zoned Public Service (PS). Most of the 13.32 acre Rosedale site has been zoned PS. Unfortunately, the east 3.46 acres was inadvertently left as Park (P1) zoning in 1998. Council is being asked to zone the east 3.46 acres from P1 to PS. This rezoning will allow the site to serve its intended use as identified in the East Hill Major Area Structure Plan.

4. Can the Catholic School Board still build a school on the site without Council rezoning the land?

Yes. The majority of the site, approximately 10 acres, is zoned Public Service (PS) which means that a school can be built there.

In order to build a school, the site would have to be reconfigured or the size of the school's second story would have to be increased.

The ball field, multi-use play surface, lights and shelter may have to be reconfigured or relocated on the site, resulting in additional costs and potential concerns from adjacent neighbours.



5. If a school is built, will Rosedale have the same amount of park space that other neighbourhoods have?

In a standard neighbourhood, 10% of the total site area is designated for a school and parks, Rosedale has 10.64% park dedication. Schools are usually located within these park areas in conjunction with playgrounds, parks and recreational facilities. Based on the guidelines of the Community Services Master Plan most neighbourhoods have a 12.5 acre central park that includes one "A" size soccer field, one "B" size ball diamond, playgrounds, multi-use play surface, open green space and a location for a community shelter. Rosedale Estates and Rosedale Meadows has an approved central school and park site plan with these amenities as well as an additional substandard soccer field that was put in on a temporary basis. The central school and park site is 13.32 acres. The remainder of the municipal reserve park space is re-distributed throughout the neighbourhood.

6. What is the impact of locating the school in the extreme south east corner of the Rosedale site?

There is no impact on the playground, community shelter, sliding hill, skating area and permanent ball/soccer fields. However, the temporary soccer field would be eliminated.

7. Why did The City develop a soccer field if a school was intended for the site?

Often a neighbourhood has a school site identified long before it has the population to warrant a school. It is The City's practice to make the best use of the available land in the short term through the provision of interim community facilities. For example, the area where the Collicutt Centre is located held temporary soccer fields at one time. In a similar fashion, a temporary soccer field was constructed on the future school site in Rosedale. This field was constructed to: eliminate weeds until the school was built; ensure the school and park site was attractive (no weeds, mud, etc.); and provide a temporary soccer field for two to three years because of the loss of two soccer fields while the Collicutt Centre was being built.

8. When was a school site first identified for the Rosedale area?

The central park site in Rosedale has been designated as a school site since 1979. The site was first identified for a K-9 school in the 1979 East Hill Concept Plan. The 1985 and 1989 East Hill Concept Plans and the 1993 East Hill Area Structure Plan all show a public elementary school. The change from a public school to a Catholic school was made through the 1998 East Hill Major Area Structure Plan which shows a Catholic K-9 school. This change was publicized in the East Hill Area Structure Plan and at a public meeting and public hearing where the whole

plan was considered. A Catholic K-9 school is also identified for the site in the 2001 Major East Hill Area Structure Plan and the 2000 Rosedale Outline Plan, both of which went through the public meeting process. At no time was this site undesignated as a school site.

9. How did The City communicate that there would be a school on this site?

Before being adopted, major city plans go through public input processes.

The East Hill Area Structure Plan, including any changes, was advertised and available for public viewing. Public meetings and a public hearing were also held.

The City also provided the Rosedale Community Association with copies of the plan. There is correspondence on file between the Recreation, Parks and Culture Department and the Community Association that speaks to the designation of the site as a Catholic K-9 school.

The Neighbourhood Plan and the East Hill Area Structure Plan are also available through the city, the real estate board or the home builders association.

10. What is the policy with respect to the signing of the site?

The Planning and Subdivision Guidelines say that school jurisdictions will sign the site as part of the implementation of the Neighbourhood Area Structure Plan. Prior to 1998, the site was signed with the following wording: "This site is available for a future Public School. No building is planned at this time. For further information telephone 342-3700". In 1998 the site changed from a public elementary to a Catholic K-9 school. The Catholic School Board acknowledges that they should have signed the site as a future K-9 Catholic school.

11. When will Council make its decision?

There will be a public hearing at City Council's June 16 meeting at 7:00 p.m.. After the public hearing, Council will consider the issue and make its decision related to rezoning.

12. What is the decision that Council be considering?

Council will consider the rezoning of the east 3.42 acres of the site from Park (P1) to Public Service (PS). The decision as to grade configuration and when or if a school is built will be made by the Catholic School Board.

Background:

This past spring the City advertised a call for proposals for several development sites identified in the Kentwood West Neighborhood Area Structure Plan, including a church site at the corner of 77th Street and Kendrew Drive. Land and Economic Development received an offer from the President of the Lethbridge Stake, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints to purchase this 1.62 Ha. (4.0 Ac.) ± parcel of land. The Church's intent is to initiate construction of a 24,460± square foot meeting house, as shown on the attached plans, as soon as they receive internal budget approval, and servicing is available.

The offer is for the advertised purchase price of \$760,000.00, or the equivalent of \$190,000.00 per acre, as determined by an independent appraisal based on the market value of the underlying multifamily use for the land. The conditions in the offer include the approval of the Church's Appropriation Committee and rezoning of the site within the next 45 days. Upon receiving these approvals, the offer to purchase form becomes a binding land sale agreement, which has been reviewed by the City Solicitor and is acceptable, with a few minor amendments, to the Land and Economic Development Department. The closing date for payment in full will be on or before September 15, 2001.

The City's Capital Budget identifies servicing this site in 2002, however, the Church has indicated they would like to proceed building either late this fall or early in the spring 2002. As tenders have now been received for the servicing work in the next phase of residential development in Kentwood West, we now know that there are sufficient funds remaining in this years Capital Budget to accommodate the servicing of the church site and road access to a gravel stage. Also, the tender allows for this work to be done as an add-on to the current contract. The completion of Kendrew Drive from Kirkland Drive to 77th Street will remain in the 2002 Capital Budget.



During the January 2001 Major Capital Budget discussions, Engineering Services put forward for Council's consideration, one new set of traffic signals in 2001 at the intersection of Hermary Street and 59th Avenue. The need to signalize this intersection was discussed with Council relative to other intersections with growing traffic demands such as 32 Street and Allan Street or 43rd Street and 52nd Avenue. We indicated that there likely are inconsistencies in the data as funds have not been available for a number of years to support an annual City wide traffic count program. It was agreed that prior to proceeding with new traffic signal work, a detailed review of existing data including some spot traffic counts and the updating of a prioritized list of potential signal locations would be undertaken and reported to Council. We have now completed this task and would like to submit this report and attached table of information for Council's consideration.

Relative traffic signal priority need is based on a procedure defined in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices of Canada. This procedure investigates the net improvements in safety, convenience, and movement of pedestrians and vehicles based on accident history, traffic volumes, pedestrian volumes, the proximity of adjacent traffic signals, and the restriction for potential signal synchronization. This procedure recommends signal installation when the total point rating for the intersection nears 100.

None of the intersections in the table are close to meeting the national standard of 100 points but the listing is a good indicator of the relative need of signalization between intersections. Motorists in smaller Cities usually have higher mobility expectations and lower tolerances than motorists in larger Cities. Therefore we would expect that smaller Cities are installing traffic signals (assuming they use this method), when the point rating is lower than the national standard. In our opinion the total points assigned to an intersection is not as important as properly determining the relative intersection needs throughout the City.

As we are anticipating installing the top three signals in the table as part of the Taylor Drive and 77 Street improvements in 2002 & 2003, we would suggest that there is no need to consider a new traffic signal installation anywhere in The City this year. The capital funds for the one signal budgeted for in 2001 will be carried forward for next year's program. Council could review this matter again during the 2002 budget consideration.

Council specifically inquired about the priority of the Allen Street/32 Street and the 43 Street/52 Avenue intersections. The Allen Street intersection ranked 10th on the warrant priority list. It is among a group of lower-delay but harder-to-cross intersections. We surveyed the 43 Street / 52 Avenue intersection this spring. It is ranked 5th on the warrant priority list. Although relatively easy to cross, this intersection has the 2nd highest number of accidents among the 24 intersections shown in the table.

Signal rating points generally increase as The City grows and develops. Unless there is a substantial land use change and corresponding traffic pattern change, a significant point increase in one year would be unlikely. We therefore believe that the signal priority list should be updated every two years. In the budget years that the signal warrants are to be updated, the additional cost to undertake new traffic and pedestrian counts will be included as an "additional budget request item". This course of action will provide a systematic updating of the priority list.

This report is respectfully submitted for the information of Council. Should further work be required, the direction of Council is requested.

RE: Rosedale School Site

As a result of the June 26 Information Meeting held at Holy Family School, the Board of Trustees of the Red Deer Catholic Regional Division No. 39 met on Friday, July 6 to review Catholic school site designations in the East Hill Area Structure Plan and the Rosedale site, in particular.

At the meeting, Mr. Dick Dornstauder, Assistant Superintendent - Finance, reviewed the results of a meeting held earlier in the week, with representatives from Parkland Community Planning, the City of Red Deer Community Services Department, and Red Deer Public School District. At this meeting, Mr. Dornstauder was informed that the residential growth projections outlined in the City of Red Deer Growth Study may not be accurate as they relate to the land in the College Park area. He was informed that development of the section of land immediately north of 55 Street and east of 30 Avenue could begin within the next five years. This land is not included as residential development in the Growth Study's 90,000 population projection for the City. Should the development of this area proceed within the next five years, ahead of some of the land located north of the Delburne Road, we would be able to consider an elementary school site in proximity to 30 Avenue and 55 Street.

We also are very aware of the opposition to our proposed middle school in Rosedale, and realize that we should have signed the site in 1998 as a future K-8 Catholic school site. We apologize for this error and will ensure that all other sites are signed in the near future. It is not our policy to hold a public meeting every time we decide to develop a previously designated school site. The type of school and order of use of sites in a previously approved area structure plan is the mandate of the elected trustees of the school division.

With this new information, our Board passed the following resolution at a special meeting held July 6, 2001:

" Resolution No. 01/07/06-01, moved by Gordon Deck,

That the Board considers an elementary school for the Rosedale site and proceeds with the development of a middle school in Lancaster Green subdivision immediately, should the City of Red Deer agree to the annexation of the section of land at the corner located north of 55 Street and east of 30 Avenue, as soon as possible, in order to support the residential development of this land in the next five years.

CARRIED."

We feel that this proposal would ensure that all parties were listened to and respected, and would allow us to proceed with the immediate development of a middle school in Lancaster Green. An elementary school would then be built on the Rosedale site sometime within the next five years.

We would also like you and the rest of Council to know how shocked and appalled we are with the comments and reaction received about a middle school in Rosedale. The community has given a strong message about their unwillingness to welcome today's youth – tomorrow's future – into their neighbourhood. This truly is a sad day for the education community in Red Deer.

Included with this letter is a copy of all comments that our office has received on the Rosedale middle school. We would appreciate discussion of our request at the July 16 City Council meeting, and look forward to your reply.

Letter from the Red Deer Catholic Regional Division #39, Dated July 10, 2001

Background Information

The Red Deer Catholic School Division #39 has two designated school sites east of 30th Avenue. They have identified the need for two schools in the next five years – a middle school and an elementary school. They are now proposing to locate the middle school in Lancaster Green and an elementary school in Rosedale. The middle school site is needed immediately while the elementary school site would be needed sometime within five years.

This memorandum will respond to the assumptions and conditions attached to locating these schools in Rosedale and Lancaster Green and recommend a course of action to Council.

Sequence of Growth

The School is predicating their decision to locate the proposed elementary school in Rosedale upon City Growth in the the section of land north of 55th Street and east of 30th Avenue . As Council is aware, this is an area of identified growth for the City. The Growth Study indicates that this is one of two new areas that should be considered for development to accommodate city growth. The Intermunicipal Development Plan allows for the City to have up to 30 years of land within City boundaries for growth needs and we are currently below the 30 year level. Any specifics of annexation need to be discussed with the County of Red Deer pursuant to the Intermunicipal Development Plan and administration is prepared to initiate this process.

Development of a Middle School in Lancaster Green

There is partial servicing available at the school site in Lancaster Green at this time. Storm and sanitary are available but water is not scheduled to be at the site until August 2002. An all weather access point is available at the north east corner of the site at the intersection of Lindsay Avenue and Lancaster Drive. Lindsay Avenue along the

east boundary of the site would not be available until fall of 2002. It is possible to advance the water service for this site to perhaps November 2001 but it would involve advancing the underground servicing of the phase 3 on the south side of Lancaster Drive just east of this site.

The school site itself has not been dedicated as Municipal Reserve by the developer. The developer has however indicated that they would be prepared to immediately begin the process of dedicating the Municipal Reserve required for the school site.

Recommended Course of Action

Based upon the foregoing, it is recommended that:

- City Council direct Administration to prepare a rezoning bylaw to redesignate the Lancaster Green school site from A1 (Future Urban Development) to PS (Public Service) to allow for development of a school on that site. Administration is also directed to immediately obtain sufficient reserve land to accommodate the school.
- City Council authorize underground servicing for part of Phase 3 to ensure that water servicing is available for the start of construction in the Spring of 2002. Council should be aware that some changes in the capital budget may be required to ensure that the site is available for the Catholic School Board construction timetable.
- City Council request the Catholic School Board to immediately erect a sign on the Rosedale site to indicate the site is an elementary school site and on the Lancaster Green site to indicate that is a middle school site.
- City Council direct administration to initiate discussions with the County in regards to annexation requirements in general and the section of land north of 55th Street and east of 30th Avenue College Park in particular.

RE: Year 2000 Electricity Price and Hedging Impacts

The intent of this report is to provide information to City Council regarding the impact on the Electric Utility of the high electricity prices during the year 2000 and the affects of the price hedging program which was managed by the Electric Utility during that same year. The results of price impacts and the hedging programs of all Alberta electric utilities for the year 2000 are now public information and a direct comparison with them can be made. The financial impacts of the high electricity prices during the year 2000 are currently the subject of an Alberta Energy and Utilities Board (AEUB) proceeding in which the City of Red Deer Electric Utility is an Applicant. This is the Electric Utility's first Application before the AEUB.

A utility's rates are prospective in nature and are set to recover the forecast expenses of that utility during a set period such as a year. During the year 2000 every utility in Alberta experienced that the actual cost to purchase electricity was much higher than the cost which was forecast and on which their rates and, hence, their revenues were based. This difference between the forecast and actual cost created a huge revenue deficit for all Alberta electric utilities.

There is always a risk that such differences will occur. There are risk management tools available, such as price hedging, which can be implemented to offset a potential negative impact. As was conveyed to Council within the Electric Utility's current Business Plan, the Electric Utility engaged in hedging activity which had a very positive affect on reducing the revenue deficit. The Red Deer Electric Utility year end position is summarized as follows:

Deficit due to high price during 2000	\$12,518,300
Offset from generators from 2000 operations	(\$ 757,300)
Net benefit from hedging program in 2000	<u>(\$ 7,276,700)</u>
Net deficit	\$ 4,484,300

Perhaps the most meaningful way of indicating the benefit of the hedging program is to express it as being the equivalent of an avoided 19% rate increase.

A summary position (as filed with AEUB) of the Alberta utilities is as follows:

During the year 2000 all of the above utilities, except Red Deer, increased their electric utility rates. Provincial regulation in the latter part of 2000 required those who had implemented such increases to remove them. The AEUB was instructed to review all aspects of the deficits resulting from the high electricity prices and to issue a decision on the amount of each utility's deficit and the year 2001 financing costs of that deficit. Any recovery of the deficit and its financing cost can only commence in 2002. Any revenues collected during the period that rate increases had been implemented had the effect of reducing the net deficit position of those utilities.

In the current AEUB proceeding regarding the year 2000 price impacts, the Red Deer position of having no rate increases in 2000 and having the most successful hedging program is drawing considerable attention from both the AEUB and the Intervenors.
