Dear Sir:-

Our Council has been requested to approve an application for permission to operate cigarette vending machines in Calgary.

Up to the present time these machines have been prohibited on the grounds that it would not be possible to control the use of the machines by minors. In addit on, it is argued that their use would cut in on the business of the smaller merchants who are required to pay a business tax in addition to the license fees for selling tobacco products.

Would you be good enough to advise me whether or not you permit cigarette vending machines to operate in your city and if so, what license fee is charged and what regulat ons are in effect with respect to supervision of their use by minors, locations at which they are permitted and any other pertinent information which might assist our Council in dealing with the problem.

Gentlemen:-

Following the recent meeting of the Red Deer Recreation Commission I have been instructed to bring these matters before you for your consideration:

(1) City Square Playground. It is suggested that fence be removed from around the wading pool and fence be constructed along Ross St. and 48th Ave. Such a move would make play area more accessible to children, would be more protection from traffic and at the same time would enable us to supervise the area with one supervisor instead of two (as was the case this year). Such a change would not have to be implemented until next spring. *Yes - Cost*

(2) That consideration be given to improving sidewalks, lighting, and parking in new arena site. (Since Commission meeting I have been given to understand that Council already has this matter in hand.)

(3) That 2 open air rinks be retained at the old arena site similar to last winter. The Commission feels that even with the new arena ice demands will be so great that these rinks will again be necessary.

Your consideration of the above suggestions would be appreciated.

Dear Sir:-

Further to Mr. Frame's letter of July 4th, in which he acknowledged receipt of your letter dated June 27th, in which you advised that the Council of the City of Red Deer wholeheartedly endorsed the resolution previously passed by the Municipal District of Lacombe, in which the Department of Highways was requested to establish a provincial highway from Red Deer to Stettler, may I advise as follows:

This Department cannot accede to your request at this time. I feel that our first responsibility in the construction of Main Highways today is to raise to present highway standards all main arterial highways in the Province. Until this is done, I deem it very unwise to take District Highways into our Main Highway network. In addition, the central part of the Province today is comparatively well served with east and west highways and we must share our highway construction program with many of the more far-flung areas of the Province rather than concentrating our highways in one area.

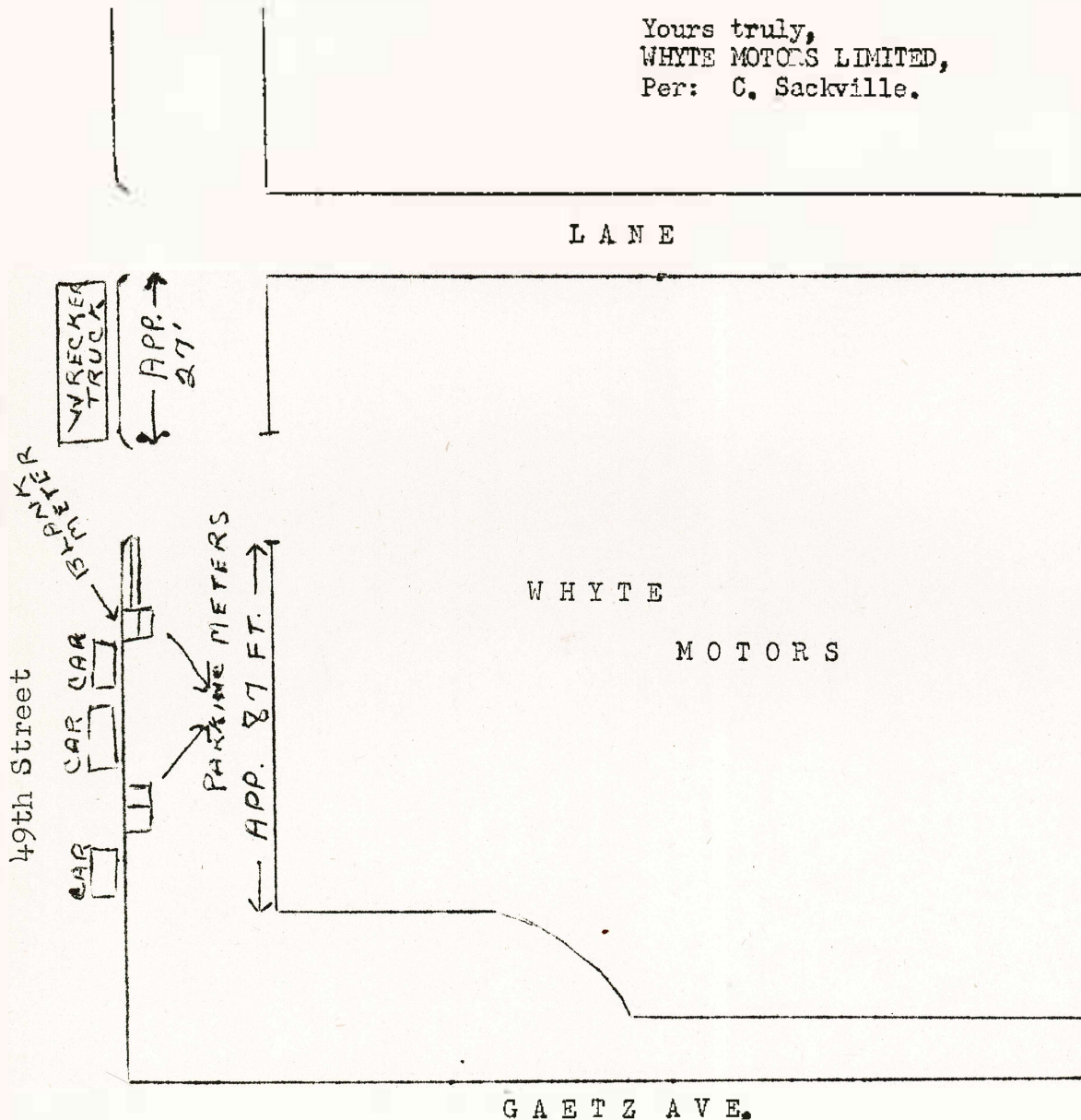

RECREATION COMMISSION
Summary of Activities- August, 1952.

Sept. 3, 1952.

Baseball & Softball:

Attempt made to complete Bantam Playoffs (local) in August but too many players still on holidays and lack of interest forced cancellation.

No action taken on Builder's Hardware Juvenile protest. Provincial officials admitted legality of Red Deer protest but finally cancelled all playoffs due to polio. Protest money refunded to Red Deer Club.

Red Deer Elks two games up on Lethbridge Miners in Provincial Senior Men's Baseball Finals. Final game or games to be played in Lethbridge on September 7th. Elks also engaged in semi-final of CABL; at present are one game down to Stettler in this series. Winner will play Eckville for league title.

Innisfail Ladies won Askin Trophy in Main Line Ladies' Fastball.

Lawrence Rockettes dropped out of Provincial contention due to injury to key players.

City Men's League now engaged in playoff for city title.

Swimming:

Pool operated 17 days during the month showing an attendance of 2184 (this includes Lacombe and P.T.S. attendance). Drastic drop in attendance last week of operation coupled with polio scare influenced decision to close early.

Wading pool operated 13 days and only showed an attendance of 291 for that time.

52 youngsters finally qualified for Advocate "Learn to Swim" Crests.

Catalina Club held swim gala on August 12th. Not too many children appeared for the races but a crowd of approximately 250 really enjoyed the show.

Lacombe used pool for swim instruction six times during the month, with a total attendance of 253. P.T.S. used the pool 4 times during the month.

Private swim lessons terminated on August 7th.

Playgrounds:

A highly successful season came to an end on August 30th with an attendance of 16917 for the month. Monthly attendance is shown in first column with season attendance in second column.

Total attendance of 32,482 for summer works out to attendance of 40 per session in comparison to total of 28,771 last summer and session attendance of 36. Parkvale and Michener Hill have only operated half time but increased attendance would point to need for full-time supervision another year.

Only two inter-playground ball games were played early in the month- supervisors reporting reluctance of parents in having their children attend other playgrounds for fear of polio. In spite of this local activities were very well attended and with few exceptions programme was followed as laid out in bulletin. Penny Carnival was one of highlights of August programme and brought out large numbers of adults.

687 adults visited playgrounds during the month, a total of 1207 for the summer.

Movies were shown on 4 larger playgrounds and reception was excellent, approximately 300 attending. It is hoped to extend films to all playgrounds next summer.

Miscellaneous:

Total of 1566 children on registration file at Commission Office.

Effort is made to register all youngsters who use our facilities but a considerable number attend who are not registered.

Summer equipment now in storage until next year.

Six meetings held in Commission Office during the month.

Next Recreation Commission meeting on September 4th at which time fall and winter programme will be discussed.

Recreation Commission Meeting - City Hall, Sept. 4, 1952.

Present were: C. Anderson, C.M. Ward, H. Gilchrist, Miss A. Olson, A. Goodacre, Dr. W.D. Parsons, P. Crawford, Mrs. T. Foster, Dr. W.A. Carter, B. Woodrow, T. Cornett, R. Holmes and C.J. Miller.

E.B. Gish, B. Bourk, I. Kaila, J. Lampard were absent from the meeting.

Meeting opened at 8:15 p.m. with Dr. Carter presiding. Minutes of previous meeting were adopted as read.

The Secretary reported that as yet the Kinsmen Club had taken no action on the question of obtaining old high school skating rink.

Discussion took place re suggestion in July report of changes at City Square playground. It was felt that removal of fence around wading pool and installation of low fence along Ross St. and 48 Ave. would provide a more suitable play area and at the same time make it possible to operate the grounds with one supervisor. On motion of Parsons and Ward the Secretary was instructed to write City Council re this suggestion.

On the matter of boxing classes for the coming winter, Messrs. Anderson and Miller were appointed as a committee to investigate possible buildings suitable for holding classes. Motion of Holmes and Gilchrist.

The matter of decentralization of Health & Recreation Classes was discussed at considerable length and it was the feeling of the meeting that Secretary investigate possibilities of this. Motion of Anderson and Cornett. Among centres suggested were Mountview School, Alliance Church (North Red Deer), Sacred Heart School (Waskasoo). Messrs. Ward and Anderson were appointed to assist Secretary in selection of suitable locations for the classes.

In the matter of Rugby Football in the Junior High it was felt that assistance should be given if sufficient interest is shown. The Secretary was instructed to purchase an additional dozen helmets if coaches can guarantee large enough turnout for a three-team league. Motion of Cornett and Parsons.

Dr. Carter was appointed delegate to annual A.A.H.A. meeting in Calgary on Sept. 27th.

Secretary instructed to write letter to St. Johns Ambulance Association endorsing suggestions made in their letter.

On motion of Holmes and Ward Secretary was instructed to contact City Council re matter of adequate provision of sidewalks, street lighting and parking at the new arena site.

On motion of Woodrow and Goodacre Secretary requested to contact City Council re need for retaining two open air rinks at old arena site.

The matter of organization of figure skating club was left in the hands of Tom Cornett. The meeting gave Mr. Cornett reasonable assurance of ice time in the new arena for such periods as would be convenient for travelling instructor.

Figures were presented to the meeting giving estimated costs for operation of juvenile hockey and junior baseball. Secretary was instructed to write Red Deer Brewery and Buffalo Association in Calgary to obtain their reaction as to sponsoring these clubs.

Report of Catalina Swimming Club was read to the meeting and adopted with thanks.

On the suggestion of Mr. Ward the Secretary was requested to write the Memorial Committee setting forth requested times for use of the gymnasium for the coming winter.

H. Gilchrist was requested to look into the matter of the proposed toboggan slide and report back at the next meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 10:45 p.m.

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POLICE COMMITTEE MINUTES
September 2/52.

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Police Committee held in the Mayor's Office on Tuesday, September 2, 1952. The meeting opened at 1:35 p.m. with Alderman Sim in the Chair. Others present were: His Worship the Mayor, Sgt. Johns and Cpl. McGregor and Messrs. Lawson and Beveridge, with Geo. Nechkin acting as Secretary.

Moved by Mayor Crawford and seconded by Sgt. Johns that the minutes of the last meeting be adopted as read.

It was agreed to recommend to the City Council that the by-law dealing with shrubbery obstructing the view at intersections be amended to read "Three feet high from the crown of the road". At present the by-law merely states that the shrubbery should not exceed three feet in height, not stating where the measurement is to be taken from.

The matter of legal liability resulting from any accidents subsequent to the erection of a fence on the north side of the river between the traffic and the C.P.R. bridge should the same be erected by the City, was again brought up and as no reply had as yet been received from the Solicitors on this matter, the Secretary was instructed to contact them again with a view to obtaining this opinion as soon as possible.

Regarding the part time parking regulations existing now in front of the theatres, it was decided to recommend to the Council that these areas be designated as "No Parking at any Time". It was decided ~~not~~ to make any special provisions with regard to parking or parking meters in front of the Post Office. The general regulations in other business sections of the City are to apply. The Secretary was instructed to advertise in the local press that the parking meter regulations will be enforced as from 9:00 a.m., Monday, September 8, 1952.

The Commission expressed themselves as opposed to the proposed programme of Stewart Petroleums on the property adjacent to the south end of the bridge as that creating potential traffic hazard.

It was agreed to recommend to the Council that the blinker light situated at the north end of Gaetz Ave. should be located further north so as to give warning to the motorists before they start going down hill as it was felt that its present location did not give a warning soon enough. It was also recommended that the present location of speed limit signs at the City limits be checked into with a view to improving their visibility.

It was recommended that the City Engineer check the present arrangement of stop signs at the intersection of 54 Ave. and 59 St. It was thought that the arrangement could be improved upon.

It was agreed to recommend that stop signs should be erected at exits from all City parking lots now existing or those planned.

It was agreed to recommend the ordering of 24 motor-head canvass bags with two metal cyclets for locking and "No Parking" stenciled on the outside.

The Parks Department is to be asked again to trim the hedge on the south-west corner of the City Square as its present condition is a traffic hazard. The Public Works Department is to be asked to grade the street next to the curb in front of the curling rink so that cars cannot climb the sidewalk and during the winter to keep snow cleared away from the curb to prevent it from building up a ramp to the sidewalk, enabling the cars to mount the sidewalk without noticing it.

The temporary traffic regulations were approved as recommended, with the exception that Section 7 dealing with 10 minute parking in front of the Post Office being struck out.

A letter was received from the Chief Provincial Bridge Engineer, Mr. L.G. Grimble, advising that it will not be possible to put any additional sidewalks on the outside of the present traffic bridge so as to allocate the present walks for bicycle use. The letter was ordered filed.

W.D. Grant's report re the traffic count and recommendations in connection with traffic control in the City, was read and the following of his recommendations were approved:

— 1. That no traffic lights be installed at the intersection of Gaetz Ave. and 49th street.

— 2. That no left turns be allowed at the intersection of Gaetz and Ross.

— 3. That a better advance notice of traffic signals at the above mentioned intersection be provided.

4. Regarding his suggestion, No. 2., that additional signal heads be installed at Gaetz and Ross Intersection, it was felt that if this was possible with our present equipment on hand that the matter should be gone into with Mr. Mills of the Electric Light Department. It was thought that a warning sign re "Traffic Signals Ahead" be done in Skotch-lite.

The meeting adjourned at 4:40 p.m.

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TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

September 30/52.

The following temporary traffic regulations are hereby authorized:

1. All vehicles shall stop before crossing the south edge of the road allowance of Ross Street when entering Ross Street from the south on 48th or 49th Avenues.
2. No vehicle shall be parked on 49 Ave. within 20 feet north of the north side of the road allowance of Ross Street on east or west side of 49 Ave.
3. No vehicle shall be parked on Ross Street:
 - (a) Within 35 feet west of the east boundary of Block 17.
 - (b) Between 71 feet and 100 feet west of the east boundary of Block 17.
 - (c) Within 65 feet east of the west boundary of Block 17.
 - (d) Within 40 feet west of the east boundary of Block 11.
 - (e) Within 34 feet east of the west boundary of Block 11.
 - (f) Within 30 feet west of the east boundary of Block 18.
 - (g) Between 180 feet and 230 feet west of the east boundary of Block 18.
 - (h) Within 35 feet east of the west boundary of Block 18.
 - (i) Within 70 feet west of the east boundary of Block 10.
 - (j) Within 40 feet east of the west boundary of Block 10.
4. No vehicle shall be parked on Gaetz Avenue:
 - (a) Within 20 feet north of the south boundary of Block 19.
 - (b) Within 27 feet south of the north boundary of Block 19.
 - (c) Between north and south boundaries of Block 18.
 - (d) Within 157 feet north of the south boundary of Block 17.
 - (e) Within 27 feet south of the north boundary of Block 17.
 - (f) Within 25 feet north of the south boundary of Block 16.
 - (g) Within 20 feet south of the north boundary of Block 16.
 - (h) Within 93 feet north of the south boundary of Block 9.
 - (i) Within 26 feet south of the north boundary of Block 9.
 - (j) Between north and south boundaries of Block 10.
 - (K) Within 253 feet north of the south boundary of Block 11, except for the purpose of fueling at the gasoline pumps of Northwest Motors.
 - (l) Between 271 feet and 294 feet north of the south boundary of Block 11.
 - (m) Between 330 feet and 353 feet north of the south boundary of Block 11.
 - (n) Within 56 feet south of the north boundary of Block 11.
5. No vehicle shall be parked on 49th Street:
 - (a) Between 130 feet and 118 feet east of the west boundary of Block 18.
 - (b) Between 82 feet and 48 feet east of the west boundary of Block 18.
 - (c) Within 28 feet east of the west boundary of Block 18.
 - (d) Within 49 feet west of the east boundary of Block 10.
 - (e) Between 153 feet and 241 feet east of the west boundary of Block 10.
 - (f) Between 162 feet and 114 feet east of the west boundary of Block 19.
 - (g) Within 30 feet east of the west boundary of Block 19.
 - (h) Within 23 feet west of the east boundary of Block 9.
 - (i) Between 153 feet and 197 feet east of the west boundary of Block 9.
6. There shall be no parking at the corners adjoining those areas designated in Sections 2, 3, 4 and 5 above.
7. No vehicle shall be parked or stopped in the parking stall located between 44 feet and 26 feet south of the north boundary of Block 9 on Gaetz Avenue except for the purpose of loading or unloading at Associate Clinic.
