The heat, however, does not seem to bother me at all. Have been divorced from the rest of our chaps and am running a one man show now. It will give me lots of opportunity to see the many interesting things in this place where I shall "stay put" for a while. - at least until I get fed up with living in a hotel. - and then will easily be able to find one of the other chaps who will be glad to take it on for a while.

Took the day off yesterday & four of us drove out to the coast to a particularly fine bathing beach. The girl I took is a nurse by the name of Eloise MacDermid from Keeweenaw River. She asked if my sister had been in C & IT work as she remembered someone of that name visiting their group. The other male member of the party was one Major Harry Banks (dentist) whom I believe you may remember at V of A. I am a bit sunburned today but can be nothing like the others who had little start on a tan. They must be suffering miserably.

Am sitting in my office now. You should see it! only 31 x 42 feet. Will have to get some photos taken. There is plenty of light for that.

Just now a dispatch has come in with two letters from for me. One is your No. 76 of Aug 13 - finished at Dresden and the other is from Pete Menzies. She is at Vancouver now, having moved

there from Edmonton where she worked for some time. She is going to work for the Can. Province. Don't remember whether that is a Saturday paper or not. Pete & I correspond fairly regularly but not more than about once every other month.
