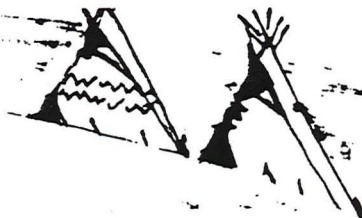
Dear Dan:

3. Street Names

Mr. Dawe reported that he had been asked by Mrs. Elizabeth Logan if the Archives Committee would be willing to add the name "Logan" to the list of recommended pioneer names for streets. He added that the Logans had been residents of the Red Deer area since before the First World War and that Mr. Lewis Donald Logan was for many years the city water filtration plant foreman.

It was moved by Fowler/Lerouge that the name "Logan" be included in the list of street names beginning with "L".

4. Urban Park Project

Mr. Dawe reported that the consultants for the Urban Park project have been hired. He stated that the groups involved included Aresco, Reid Crowther, Nautilus and Oxbow Historical Research Limited. Mr. Dawe added that the various historical archeological and interpretive assessment studies were to be completed by mid-October.

5. Weekly Newspapers

Mr. Dawe reported that the one year trial subscriptions to the Rocky Mountain House Mountaineer and the Innisfail Province were running out shortly. He also reported that Mr. and Mrs. Neil Evans were donating their copies of the Red Deer County News and that Mrs. Graham was clipping the Lacombe Globe.

It was moved by Taylor/Ede that the subscriptions to the Mountaineer and the Innisfail Province be continued.

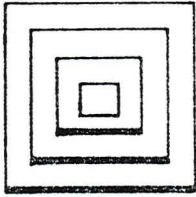
