

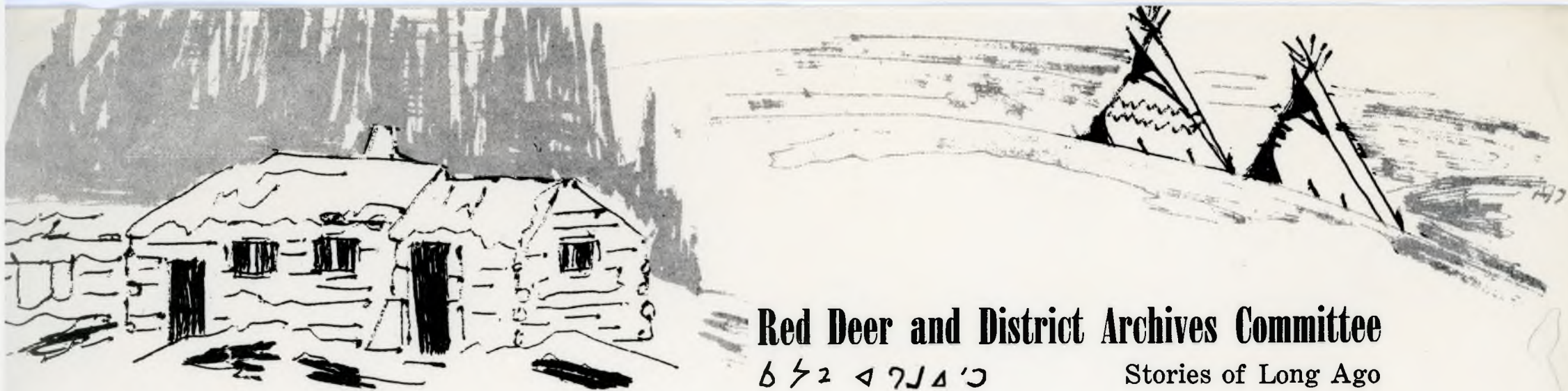


A rough sketch for a suggested letter head theme to represent the historic people of the Central Alberta area was presented to the Archives Committee in early 1965, by Alderman Mrs. L.H. Taylor.

Upon the Committee's approval of the theme, Mrs. N.C. (Alma) Tedford and Mrs. Keith (Ellen) Blore members of the Red Deer Art Club created the sketch. "Stories of Long Ago" was taken from the title of the book written by Annie Gaetz.

John Samson, at that time Chief of the Hobbema Indian Reserve, and President of the Indian Association of Alberta, did considerable research to obtain as accurate an interpretation in Cree as possible, and provided the Cree drawing.

Fletcher Printing Company, with the great personal interest of Mr. Ernie Fletcher and one of his staff continued research of the best means of printing the submitted letter head, changing the tree background to a lighter tone to better convey perspective and depth.
